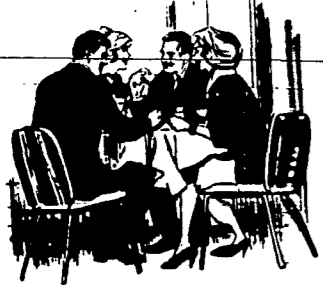
**Time to Register for Camp**

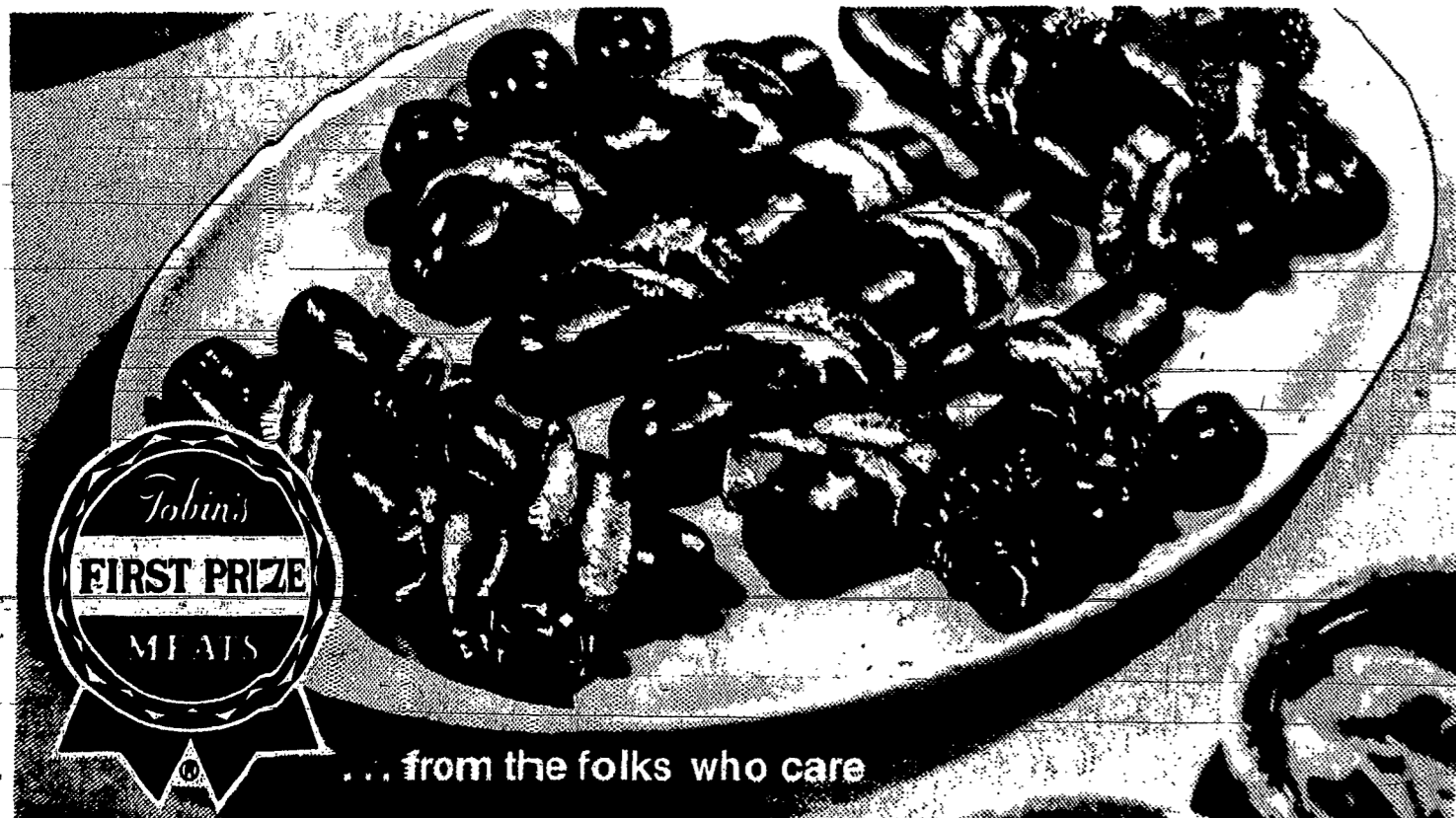

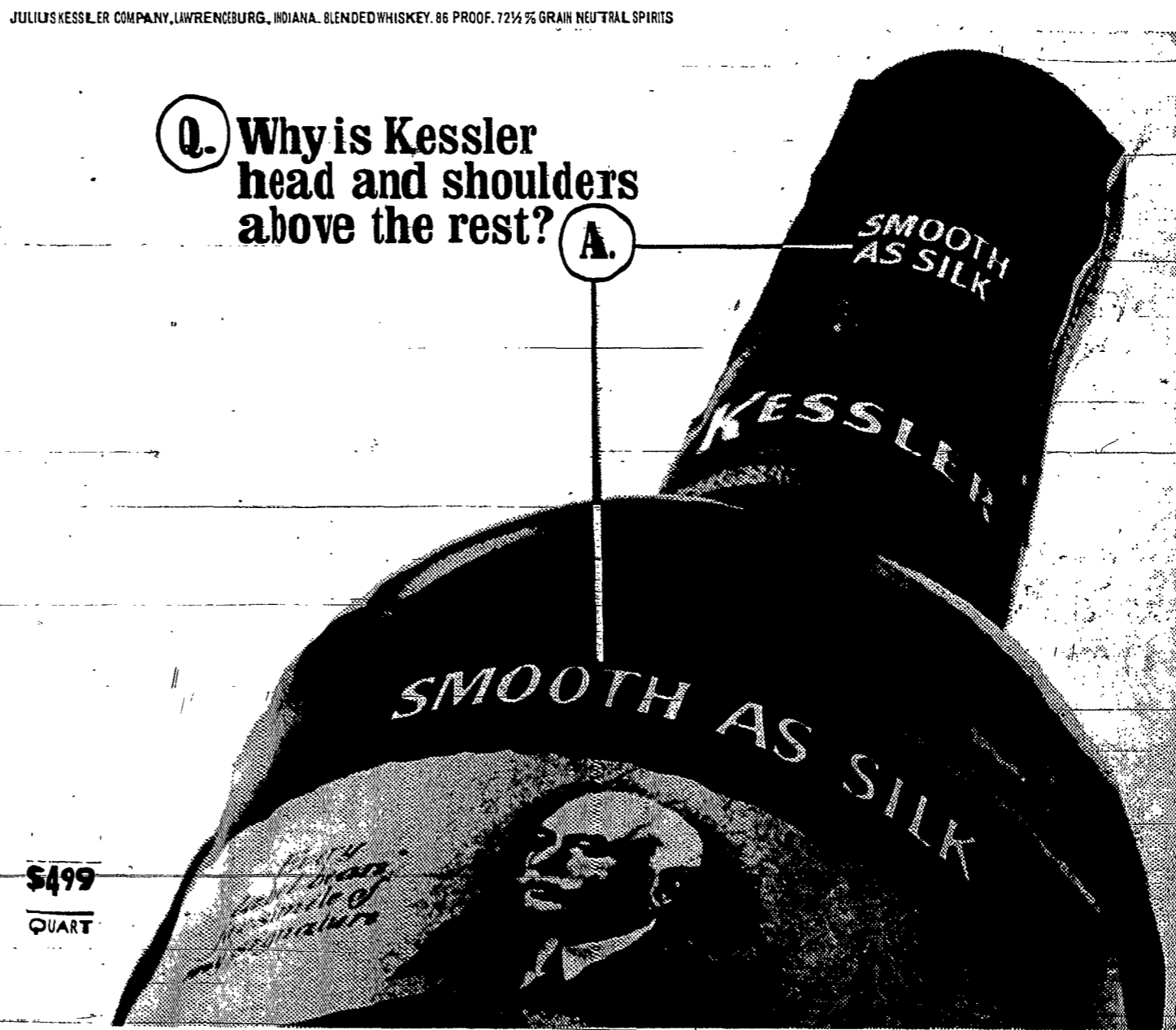
