ized programs and procedures which will provide for the attraction, motivation and retention of necessary lay personnel.

3. Finance and Statistics: To review and make recommendations regarding possible sources of revenue, both public and private — to contribute to the development of procedures for economical dispersal of funds available.

4. Curriculum Committee: To review current and proposed curricula and methods of instruction and propose changes or additions, subject to the approval of the Bishop and Diocesan Superintendent of Schools.

5. Public Relations Committee: To promote understanding of and support for the aims of Catholic education within and between various parishes, and externally within the community.

area Board should probably confine its deliberations to policy matters where policies should be uniform, or nearly so, in the area system. In school administrative matters it should be involved only insofar as it can supply or collect information which can be used by the schools in their own decision making processes. Obviously, the area Board should represent the system which it serves to the general public but it should only do so where authorized and it can not represent individual schools.

Works With Public Schools

It was fortunate that the CCCSB was in existence at the time the National Education Act was passed, otherwise, the Public Board of Education would not have had a private school agency to work with in assessing the needs of the deprived children in the community.

Who should be on a School Board?

The areas of interest of the board suggests specialties the various Board members should have. Education, finance, personnel, public relations, building trades, etc. Certainly, each parish having a school and each part of the area served by the Board should have a representative.

The scope of interest is one good argument for the existence of a school board. No single administrator, no matter how talented or well educated, is likely to be an expert in all of these fields nor is he, in our society, likely to have the time or personnel to consider adequately all of these functions. It is likely, however, that any given area will have people (including pastors, teachers, and laity) who are competent in the various special fields of interest and who would be willing to strive on such a School Board.
