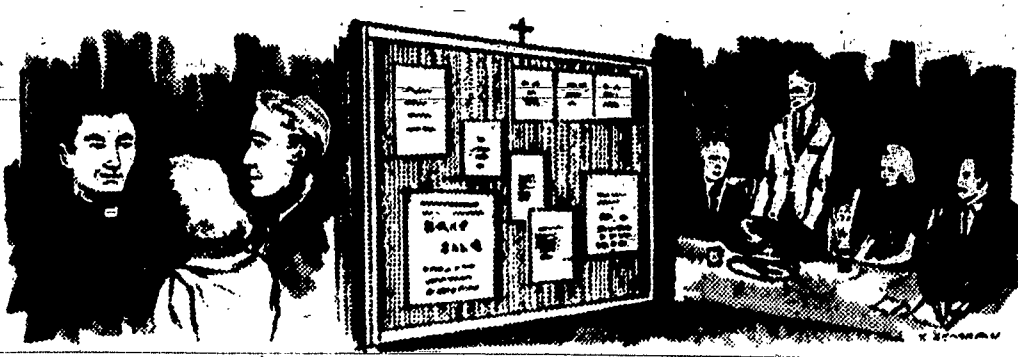


### Cenacle Lists Fr. Schlaerth
