The Very Rev. James J. Shanahan, S.J., provincial of the Buffalo Province of the Society of Jesus announced that on June 21, Father Albert P. Bartlett, S.J. will be appointed President and Rector of McQuaid Jesuit High School. He succeeds Father Robert F. Grewen, S.J.
