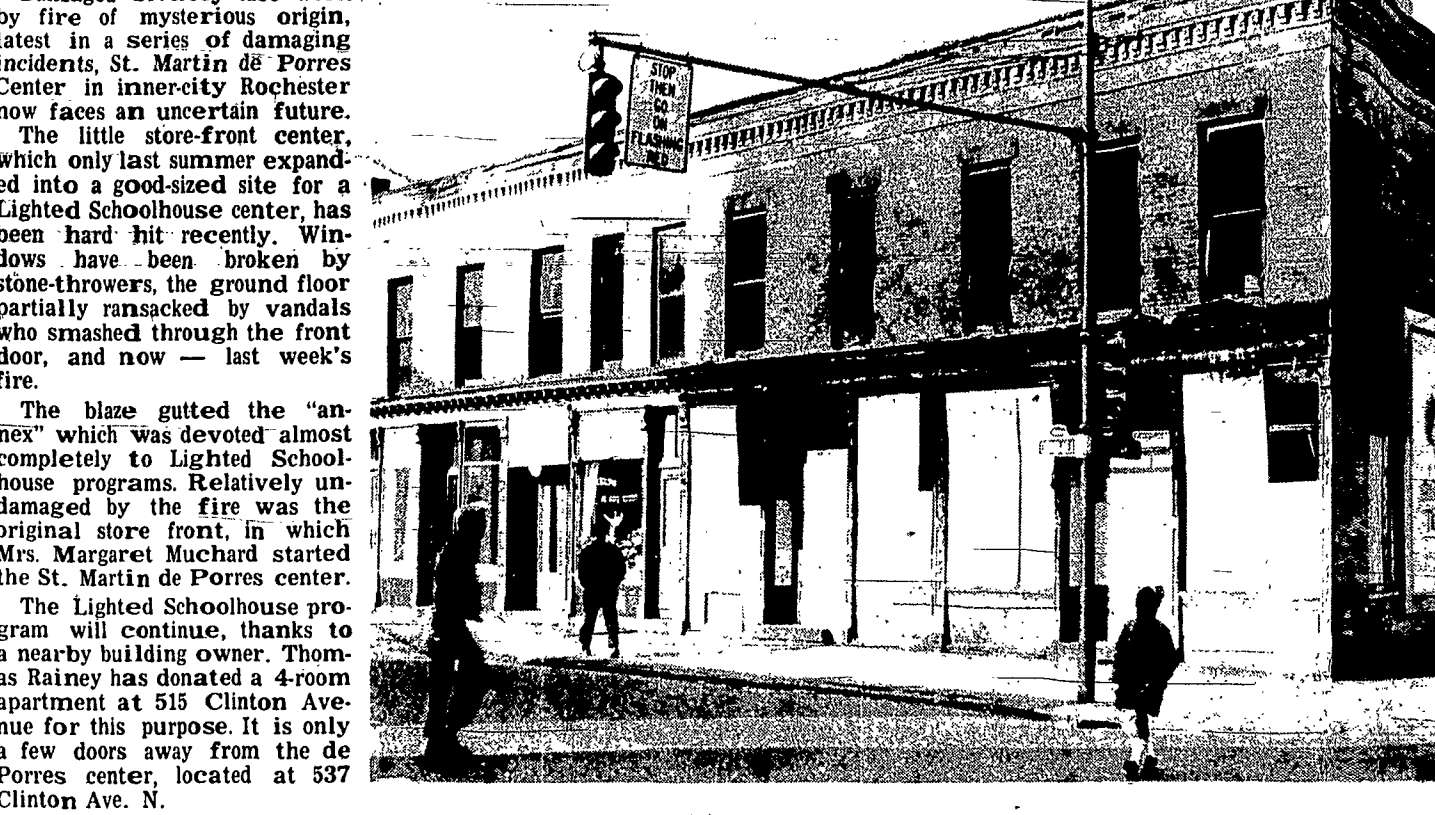

Stricken Center Ponders Future

Damaged severely last week by fire of mysterious origin, latest in a series of damaging incidents, St. Martin de Porres Center in inner-city Rochester now faces an uncertain future.

The little store-front center, which only last summer expanded into a good-sized site for a Lighted Schoolhouse center, has been hard hit recently. Windows have been broken by stone-throwers, the ground floor partially ransacked by vandals who smashed through the front door, and now — last week's fire.

The blaze gutted the "annex" which was devoted almost completely to Lighted Schoolhouse programs. Relatively undamaged by the fire was the original store front, in which Mrs. Margaret Muehler started the St. Martin de Porres center.

The Lighted Schoolhouse program will continue, thanks to a nearby building owner, Thomas Rainey, who has donated a 4-room apartment at 515 Clinton Avenue for this purpose. It is only a few doors away from the de Porres center, located at 537 Clinton Ave. N.

Wednesday night, the center's board of directors decided to continue operations in the two rooms left undamaged.

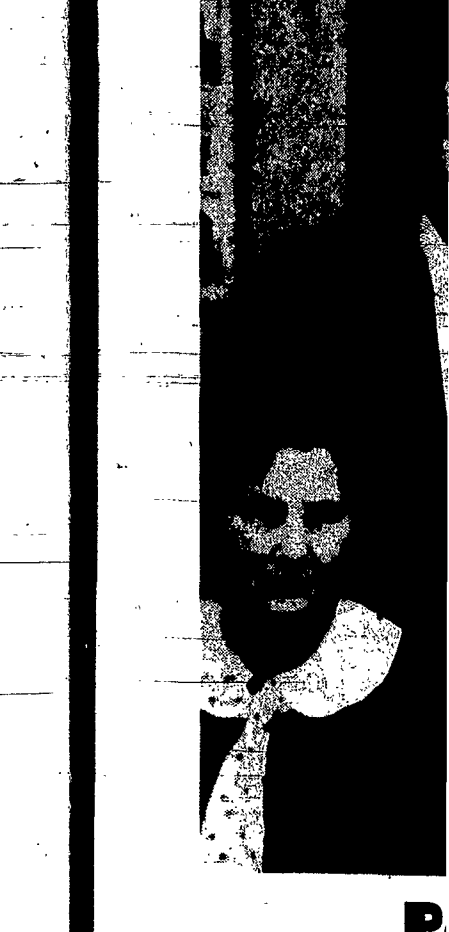
