## Birth Control Report Delay

Rome — (RNS) — Paul VI's commission birth control announcement was impossible to schedule when it was able to issue a report on which the Pope reported asked for firm recommendations by June 24. The mission is made up of 12 members, assisted by a large group of doctors, social scientists, theologians and theologians.

However, a statement by Father Henri de Riviere, Dominican theologian serving as commission secretary, said that "to fix a certain date for the completion of its work and for announcement of the report" was not possible.

At the same time, the commission "was not without anxiety as its reports were being prepared."

According to some sources, the commission report may not be until the end of the year.

The papal commission established in June, 1964, was recently reorganized. It was headed by Cardinal Giovanni D'Ercole, who was unable to agree on a report. Church should retain the right to accept, allow limited birth control pills, general use of contraceptives.
