Very Rev. Marvin J. LeFrois, a native of Rochester with three brothers also in the priesthood is head of the newly established Albany Deanery in Georgia. It was announced by Bishop Thomas J. McDonough, Bishop of Savannah.

Father LeFrois is a brother of Father Vincent E. LeFrois, pastor of Holy Angels Parish, Nunda and Holy Name, Groveland in this diocese. The other brothers are: Father Christian Glenn LeFrois, O.S.B., who is a veteran Chaplain in the United States Air Force and Father Joseph LeFrois, S.S.J., Norfolk, Va.

Father LeFrois was born in Rochester, the son of Mr. and Mrs. George LeFrois of Stone Road. He attended St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminars and was ordained in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Rochester, June 11, 1949.
