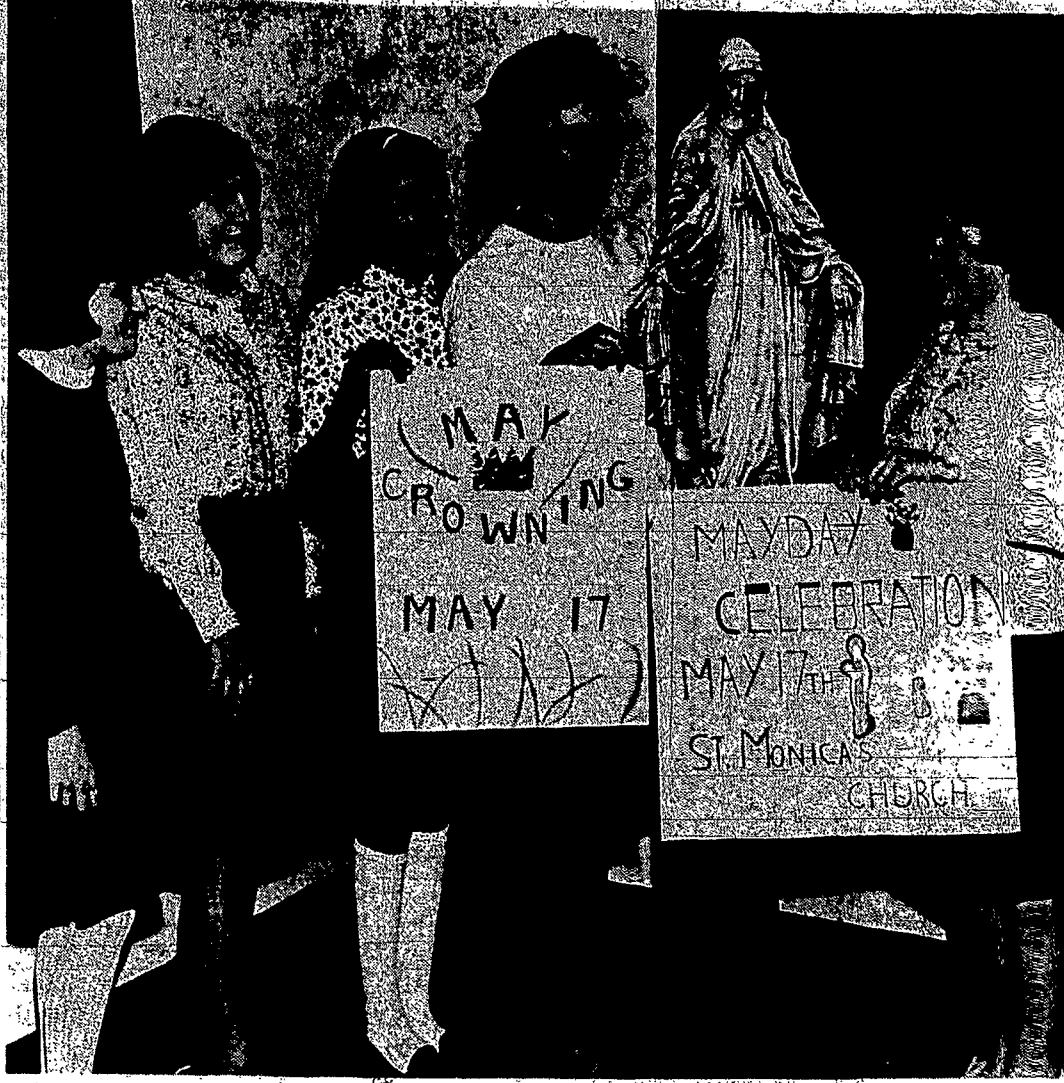

### Ad Altare Dei Awards At Cathedral on May 25

Area who have qualified for the Ad Altare Dei award will receive this coveted honor at Sacred Heart Cathedral on Wednesday, May 25 in a 7:45 p.m. ceremony.

Approximately 125 Boy Scouts are expected to get the awards, which will be presented by Father Robert Winterkorn, Diocesan Scout chaplain. Candidates, in full uniform, will report to the Cathedral rectory by 6:45 p.m. according to chairman William C. Dieter. Dieter, a leader in the Highland district, is from Queen of Peace parish. He will be assisted by Herbert Zimmer.

Troops having a candidate for the Ad Altare Dei award are invited to be represented with a color guard, American flag and troop unit flag. Other troop members are also, welcome.

### AOH Plans Ireland Tour

Seventy-five people have signed up for the fifth charter flight to Ireland and the Continent sponsored by the Guild of Our Lady of Knock under the auspices of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.

The passengers will travel by jet plane departing from Rochester on Thursday, July 21 and returning August 11. Three tours are being offered: Tour "A" - Rochester, Shannon, Rochester; Tour "B" - Rochester, Shannon, Lucerne, Rome - six day boat trip out of Athens stopping at the Grecian Isles, Turkey, Athens, Amsterdam and Rochester; Tour "C" - same as Tour "B" but eliminating the boat trip and taking in the Holy Land.

The entire trip will be for 21 days and will be under the direction of Father George Wood, Monroe County Chaplain of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.

There will be a meeting for all passengers and their friends at the Hibernian Club, 45 Alexander Street on Sunday, May 22 at 3 p.m.

The group meets several times yearly for lectures and discussion on topics of mutual interest. In the beginning of the 1964 school year, the organization invited Catholic School principals to become members.

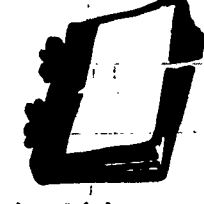

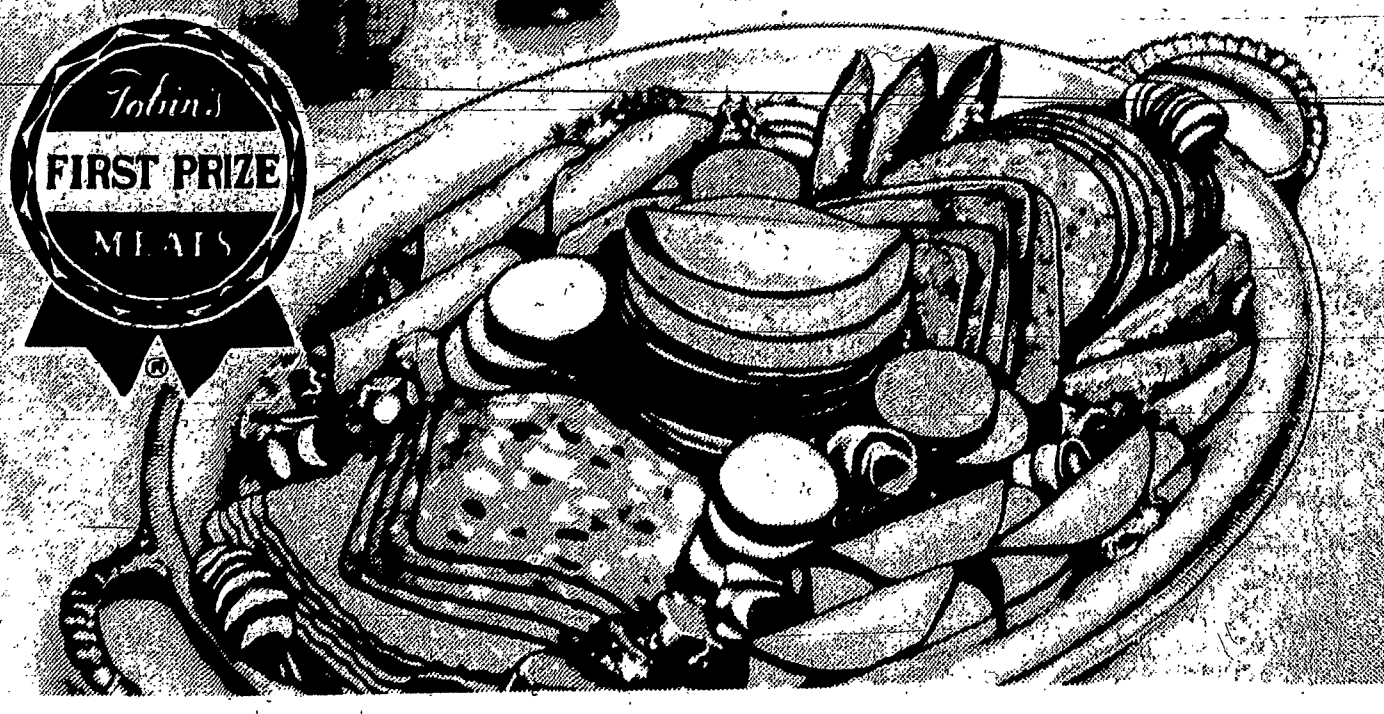
