Elmira Woodworker

James "Bud" Farley, of 1009 Oak St. in St. Cecilia's parish in Elmira, has left his mark in his home parish, mostly in the form of skilled woodworking. He has recently completed supervising the remodeling of the church's sanctuary, revised to meet the needs of the revised Liturgy.

The renovation, begun last fall, is nearing completion now. It included extension of the sanctuary into the church, rebuilding the altar platform for a new altar purchased from William J. Woerner and Sons in Rochester (but donated by Farley), building an altar of reposition and paneling the sanctuary.

Born in St. Cecilia's parish, the 58-year-old carpenter has lived there most of his life. A graduate of the parish school in 1922, he has seen all three of his sons graduate from St. Cecilia's too.

This isn't the first time that "Bud" Farley has put his skilled hands to work in his parish. In 1955, he guided a redecoration program in the parish rectory and convent, under the late Father Thomas Manley, then pastor. He has had several volunteer helpers with the present sanctuary remodeling, but has done the greater part of the woodworking himself.

Renovates His Parish Church

The genial craftsman remarks that it has been a source of personal satisfaction to help beautify the Church that has meant so much to him. "The parish has done a lot for me and my family," he says simply.

Father E. Leo McMannus, pastor of St. Cecilia's, says that the parish is "especially proud" that such a satisfactory and attractive job of remodeling has been done by hometown skill.

The new altar of repose utilizes the former tabernacle, and some of the wood of the old pews was used in building the new one, to preserve the traditions of the past Father McMannus stated.

Father Abbott: Professional Ecumenist

New York — (CFF) — According to the press release, his title come September will be Director of the North American Section of Vatican Radio. But those who know Jesuit Father Walter M. Abbott best are sure that he'll manage to slip in the adjective "ecumenical" somewhere on his letterhead.

"I've become a professional ecumenist," the 42-year-old Jesuit said in his office at "America," where he has been an associate editor of the weekly review for the last eight years. "I see my role in communications as a guide in fulfilling the dream of Pope John, because I've been up close."

"UP CLOSE" refers to the Second Vatican Council, whose direction he helped shape with one book, "Twelve Country Letters" — a collection of interviews with Council leaders after the first session — and whose teachings he is helping to implement with another book, "Documents of Vatican II," a 45c, 316-page paperback that contains the 16 Vatican Council documents, introductory comments to each by a Catholic authority, and follow-up commentaries by Protestant or Orthodox experts.

"This is the blueprint for the Church in the next 25 years," said Father Abbott, who as editor of the paperback directed his own team of translators ("the early translation of the Constitution on the Church actually has heresies in it, because the language is so distorted") and lined up the Catholic and Protestant contributors, all of whom met their deadlines — two of them in spite of serious illness.

Father Abbott puts a 25-year longevity limit on Vatican II's blueprint because "I expect another ecumenical council by 1990."

"The way things are going, it is possible that the next Ecumenical Council could be a Council of Reunion between the Eastern Orthodox and Roman Catholic Churches," he says, "and this could come by 1990. It is not likely that there will be hope of Catholic-Protestant unity by 1990, but we should be well on the way to it by then."

Father Abbott believes that much of the groundwork for the reunion of the Orthodox and Roman Catholic Churches is being done in the United States "because the United States is more and more attracting the best Orthodox thinkers and scholars."

Greatly helping the cause, Father Abbott points out, is the fact that "no country in the world is as ready for dialogue as we are. In this country the

Church has the best-prepared lay people in the world for dialogue, because they are the best-educated Catholic people."

And, he suggests, the ecumenical movement will get nowhere without the participation of the lay people. He singles out earlier unsuccessful attempts at reunion between the East and West — the Councils of Lyons and Florence — and notes that historians have put much of the blame on the lay "lack of understanding and cooperation." But in America, he notes, the Church has a new breed of lay people.

"American Catholics, like most American people, are doers — not just hearers, readers, talkers," he says. "They will not be satisfied with an annual ecumenical breakfast or supper. In the Decree on Ecumenism they have a mandate for much more. They are already looking for common study-club work, regular neighborhood dialogue sessions and common witness, especially in

social work. They are consoled to learn from the Decree on Ecumenism what they had often suspected was true: they can learn a great deal from and can be inspired in many cases by their separated brethren."
