

Sunshine and Splendor Highlight Days to Remember



Bishop Casey was welcomed to a sunshine-bright Paterson Wednesday morning, May 11. A police escort led him past an estimated 20,000 people who cheered him, knelt to receive his blessing. The next day, a rainy day, he was solemnly installed at St. John the Baptist Cathedral to be fifth bishop of the 29-year-old, three county diocese of Paterson which counts more than 375,000 Catholics. 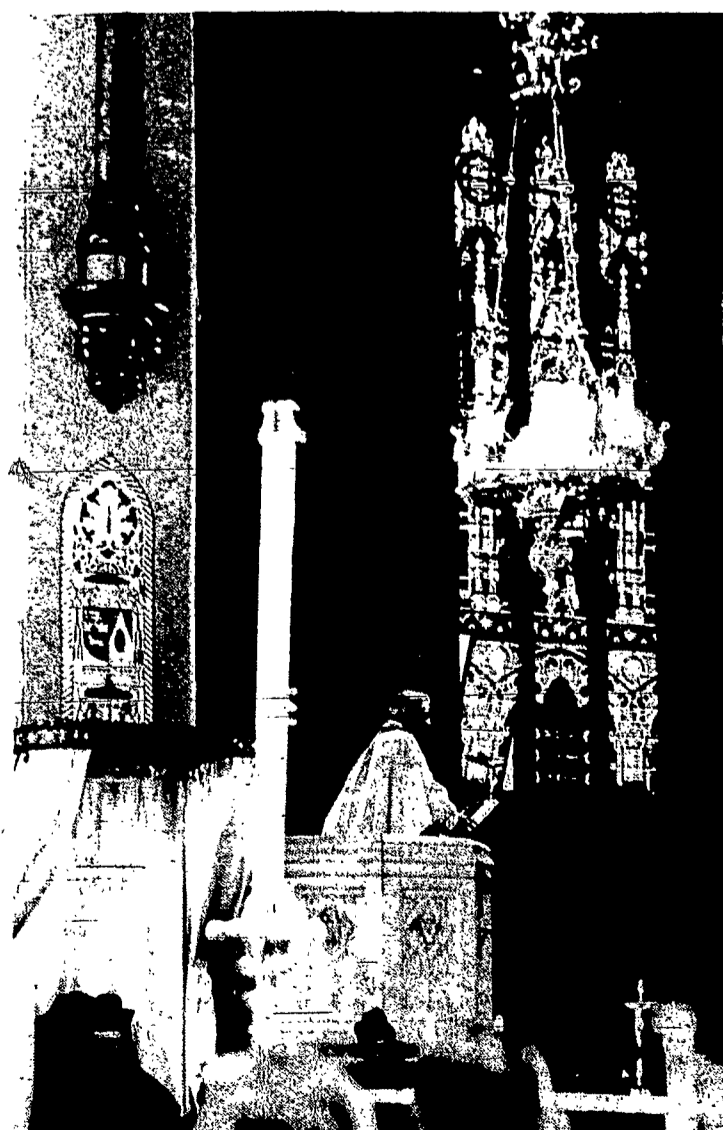

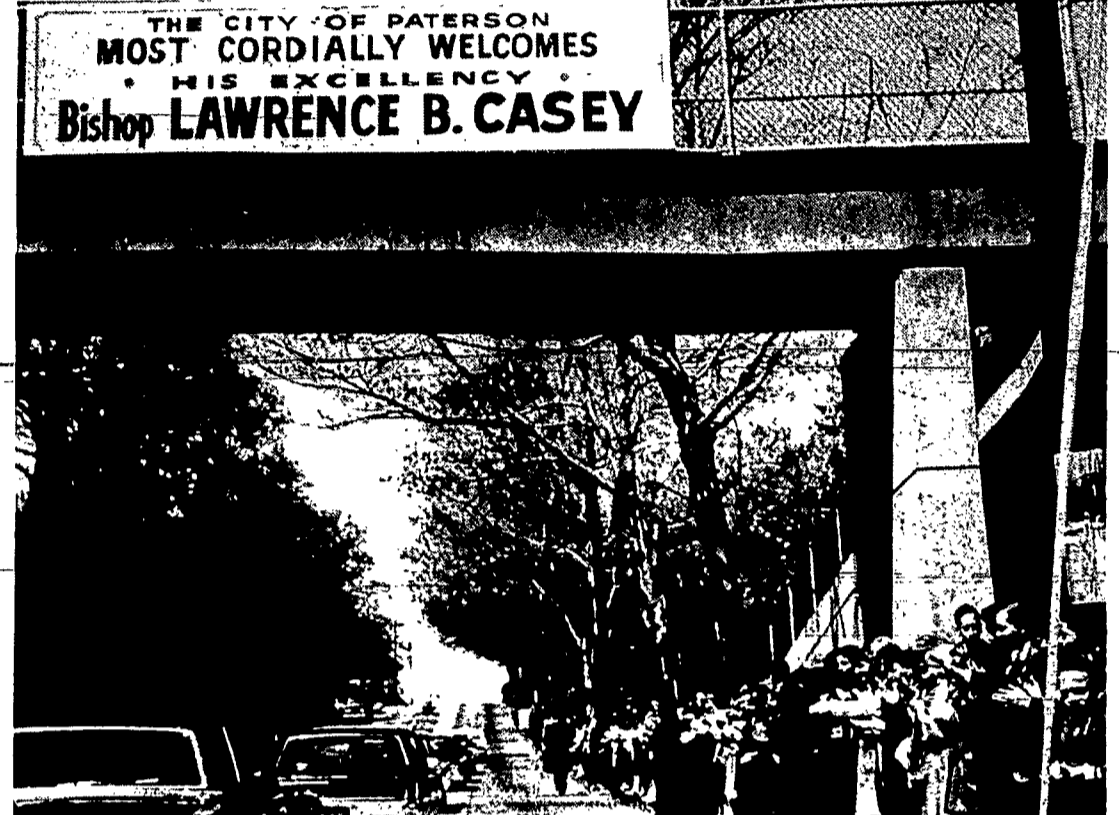

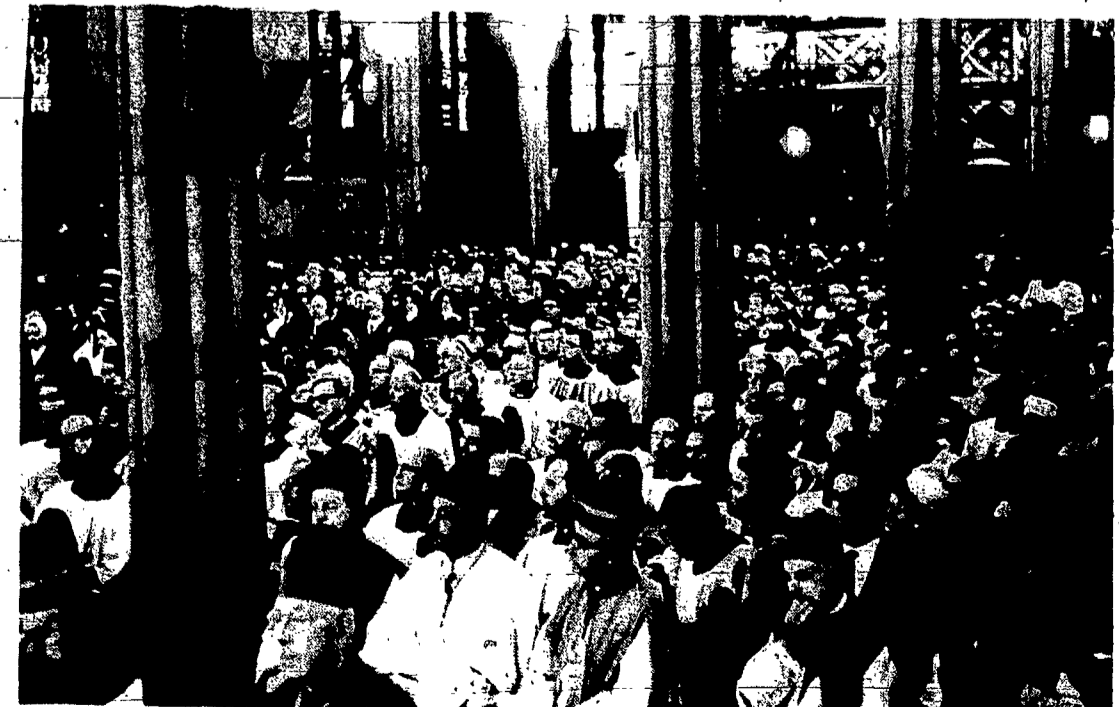
