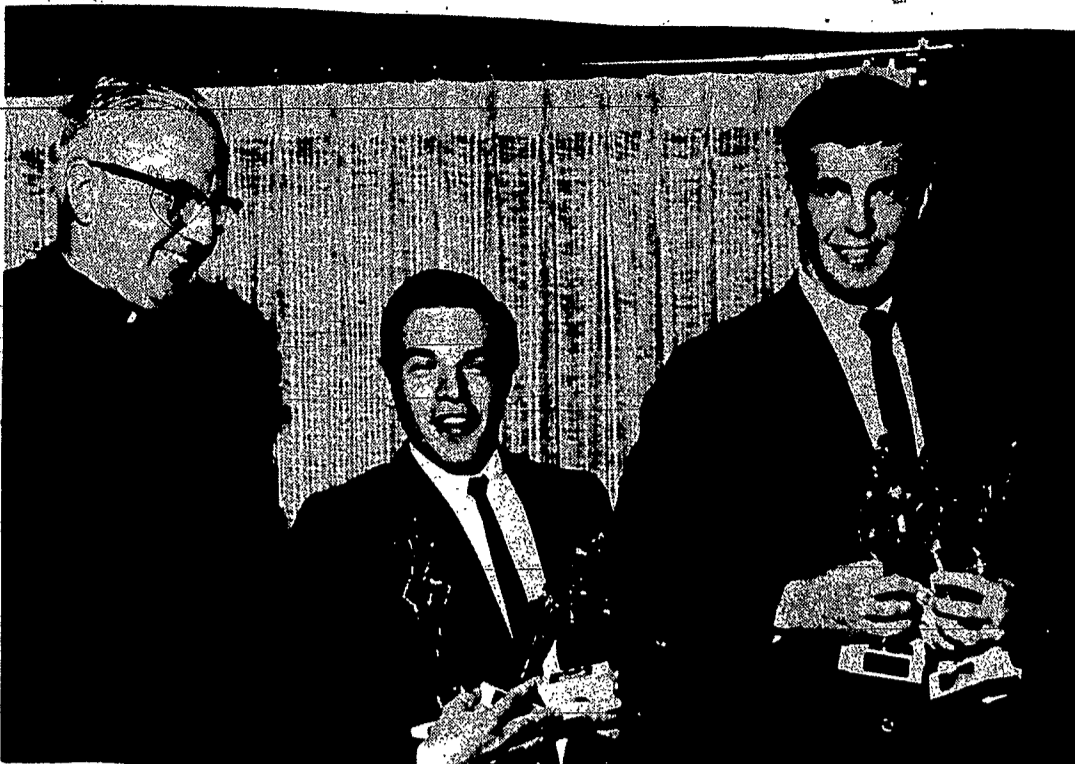

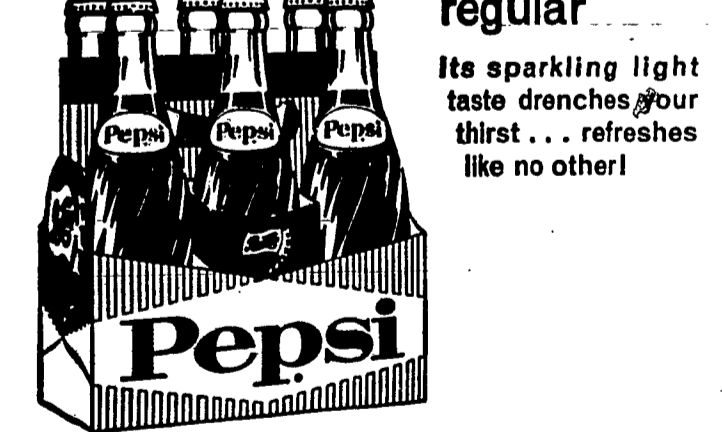

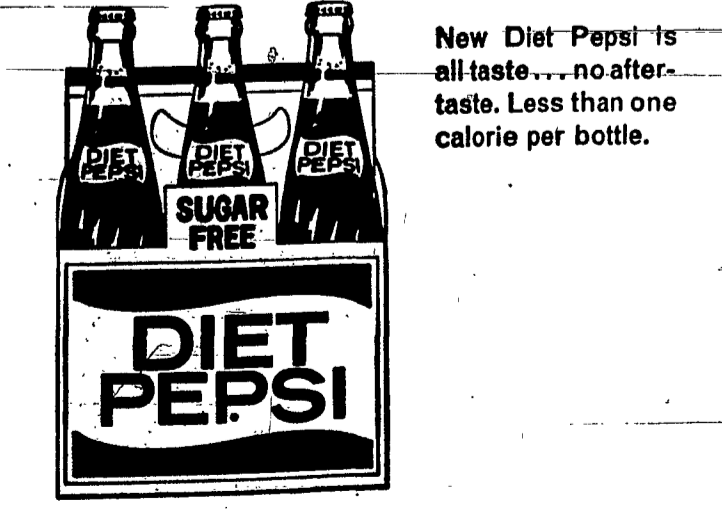

# Mooney. 10 Straight, Unbeaten on Diamond

The hustling Cardinals of Cardinal Mooney high school chalked up their 9th and 10th straight wins against Bishop Kearney and Aquinas high schools this past week. The victories gave the Cards undisputed possession of first place in the newly organized Catholic high league.

Mooney's Jim Butler bested Kearney's Rip Coleman last Friday, 5-2, a fine pitching duel. Both pitchers performed well as Coleman struck out 13 Cardinal batters and Butler did the trick to 12 King hitters.

Mooney opened the scoring as second baseman Terry Murphy singled, advanced to third on a sacrifice and scored on an error to put the Cards ahead 1-0. In the third, Murphy doubled and scored Mooney's second run on Don Lenzo's single to short left field.

Kearney scored one in the 4th as Al Ozminowski walked and scored on Coleman's triple. The Cardinals exploded for 3 big runs in the 5th as Jim Butler got on base on an error, Ken Khuns singled and both were moved up on a sacrifice. Terry Murphy walked to load the bases. Centerfielder Tom Hayes singled sharply to score Butler and Khuns with Murphy moving to third. Jim Nealon, Cardinal third baseman, drove Murphy home with a line drive single.

**ON SUNDAY**, Mooney clipped Aquinas 4-2.

Ken Harrington, Cardinal lefty, struck out 13 while giving up 5 hits.

The Cardinals opened the scoring in the first inning as Terry Murphy walked, was sacrificed to second and scored on an error to put Mooney ahead 1-0.

Aquinas came back as Dave D'Ettore singled, second baseman Beers doubled to score D'Ettore and scored himself on Prescott's single.

Mooney went ahead in the third as Terry Murphy singled, Don Lenzo doubled and Tom Hayes singled to drive in both runners.

# Kearney Drops 2 Track Meets

Bishop Kearney's track squad dropped two meets last week, to McQuaid by an 88-43 count, and to Mooney, 91-45. The two defeats lowered the Kings' season mark to 24.

Three King athletes shone in defeat, with wins in both meets: Mike Kelly (2-mile), John Numetho (triple jump) and Jim Trot (pole vault) stood out in their team's losses.

# Aquinas Tops Bowling Loop

McQuaid's Bob Kehoe paced the Catholic Interscholastic Traveling Bowling League with a 636 triple, but Aquinas' depth paid off to give the Irish the crown in the first year of the local Catholic high school league, completed this week.

Aquinas placed first with a 397 won-lost record, followed by Bishop Kearney's excellent 37-11 showing. Cardinal Mooney placed third with a 13-35 effort. Despite Kehoe's torrid series, McQuaid managed only 11-37.

Coached by Father Joseph A. O'Reilly, C.S.B., veteran bowling coach at the boys' school, Aquinas took the high team series with a 2890 total and collected a 1052 for the best team game.

Jerry Reynell of Aquinas led all bowlers with a 188.9 average, nosing out schoolmate Nick Schwab who posted at 188.27.

# Aquinas Relay Records In Jeopardy Saturday

Records were made to be broken, and plenty of marks could fall in the third annual Aquinas Relays Saturday afternoon at the University of Rochester's Fauver Stadium.

A field of 28 teams, representing schools throughout Western and Central New York and Canada, is entered in the program which begins at 1 p.m.

Entered are Kearney, Mooney, McQuaid and Aquinas from the local Catholic schools; Franklin, Edison, Marshall, East and Monroe from the public schools. County schools are represented by Brighton, Webster and Penfield. Other entries are from Syracuse, Buffalo, Niagara Falls, Hamball, Kenmore, Cortland, Williamsville, Olean, Auburn and East Bloomfield. Canada's lone entry is St. Michael's College School of Toronto, best known for its outstanding hockey clubs.

# Kearney 9 8-2 For Year

Strong pitching provided three more wins for the Bishop Kearney baseball team last week as the Kings downed Churchville-Chill (5-2), East Rochester (14-2) and McQuaid (2-0). Only a 5-2 loss to undefeated Mooney marred the King's week.

Bill Mushman and Rip Coleman have been dividing the Kearney mound chores, and have brought their club to an 82 season's mark.

In their last outing, Sunday, the Kings blanked McQuaid, 2-0. Coleman ignited his team's attack in the second with a single, moved to third on an error, and scored on Rich Fox's single.

# Cards Take Two Meets, Bow Once

The Cardinal Mooney track and field men got over the 500 mark for the year with two wins against one loss in recent competition. The Cards lost to Aquinas, 81-46, then came back to down Kearney 91-45 and East Rochester, 70 1/2-47 1/2.

Jim Harrington was a double winner in all three meets in his two specialties, the high and broad jumps. Against Kearney, he set two school records, with a 5-10 high jump and a broad jump of twenty feet 7 1/2 inches.

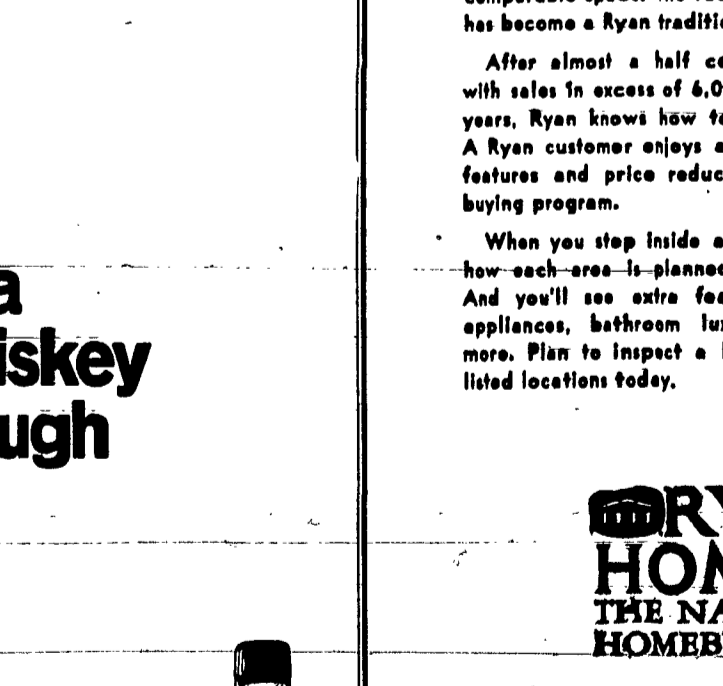
