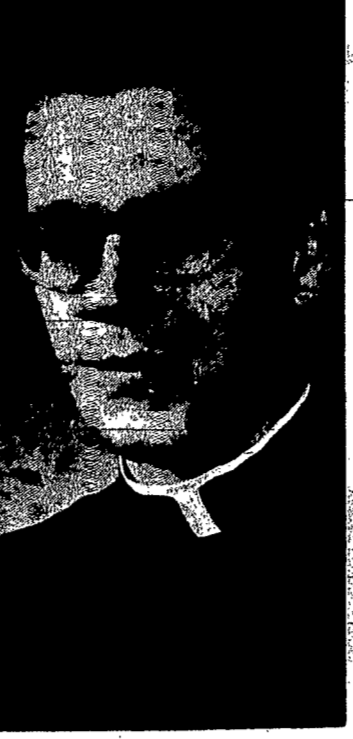

Jubilee Year's Focus on Home

(Continued from Page 1) him to demonstrate that they are one with him in faith and sacrifice, in mind and heart. But just what does a jubilee involve? All jubilees are occasions for abandoning sin, mending our ways, and thus meriting from the Church the forgiveness of sin and the temporal penalties due to it.

The most familiar jubilees are those which take place during the Holy Years. Papal jubilees of this sort date at least from 1300, and they find their basis in the Old Testament practice of the jubilee of renewal and pardon. In the Holy Year jubilees, the faithful are invited to make a pilgrimage to Rome, to receive the sacraments, and to pray for the intentions of the pope, and thus to merit the plenary indulgence of the jubilee. For some centuries these Holy Years of Jubilee have taken place every twenty-five years.

In addition to the Holy Year jubilees, the popes have also proclaimed extraordinary jubilees — over eighty of them since the sixteenth century. It was Pope Leo X who announced the first extraordinary jubilee. This was in 1518. It was restricted to Poland, and had as its purpose the intercession for the victory of Polish arms over Mohammedan invaders. Later extraordinary jubilees have usually had some such intercessory purpose. Jubilees were declared in connection

with the Council of Trent and the First Vatican Council to implore the aid of the Holy Spirit on their deliberations. What is different about the jubilee of 1966 is that it comes after the Council, and has as its intent not only thanksgiving but the rallying of Catholics to achieve an aggiornamento, as he called it: an updating of the Church which would make its efforts more fruitful in today's atomic age. He explained this in his opening speech to the Council Fathers: "By bringing himself up to date where renewal and pardon. This resolution of renewal is nowhere better expressed than in the Prayer of the Faithful which forms a part of the special jubilee Mass. In this prayer, after the faithful and celebrant have made intercession for the Holy Father, Each time one of the faithful attends such a Mass during the period of the jubilee — 1966 — he may merit another indulgence. Like all the indulgences of the jubilee, these are applicable, by those who gain them, to the souls in purgatory. Another plenary indulgence can be gained by those who attend the bishop's chief jubilee Mass of the year — on Pentecost Sunday in his Diocese — through the special papal blessing which the local bishop is authorized to bestow on this occasion. In addition to attending the bishop's Mass, we will be able to obtain a plenary indulgence by making a visit to the Cathedral and reciting there a profession of faith. This indulgence can be obtained only once. To

The indulgences themselves are attached to several particular devotional practices, subject to the arrangements of the local bishop. In the Diocese of Rochester, the faithful will be able to obtain a special plenary jubilee indulgence under the usual conditions (confession, Communion, and prayer for the pope's intentions) whenever they attend a Mass solemnized by His Excellency Bishop Kearney in the Rochester cathedral or some other church of the Diocese. The Bishop may also request another bishop to offer a similar Mass in the Cathedral or another diocesan church; and in this case the same indulgence is capable of being gained.

Those who are unable, for reasons of health or other causes, to either attend the bishop's Masses or make the cathedral pilgrimage, should not fear that they will be excluded from the indulgence. Their confessors can change the requirements in their case into some good work that they are capable of doing. Therefore the jubilee which is now proclaimed in the Diocese of Rochester will give us all an opportunity, gathered around our Bishop, to pledge our dedication, as one portion of the universal flock, to the ideals of the Second Vatican Council. May our Christian faith and Christian practice burn brighter by reason of this fervent consecration. Then we will truly become the light to the world that Pope John XXIII dreamed we would be.
