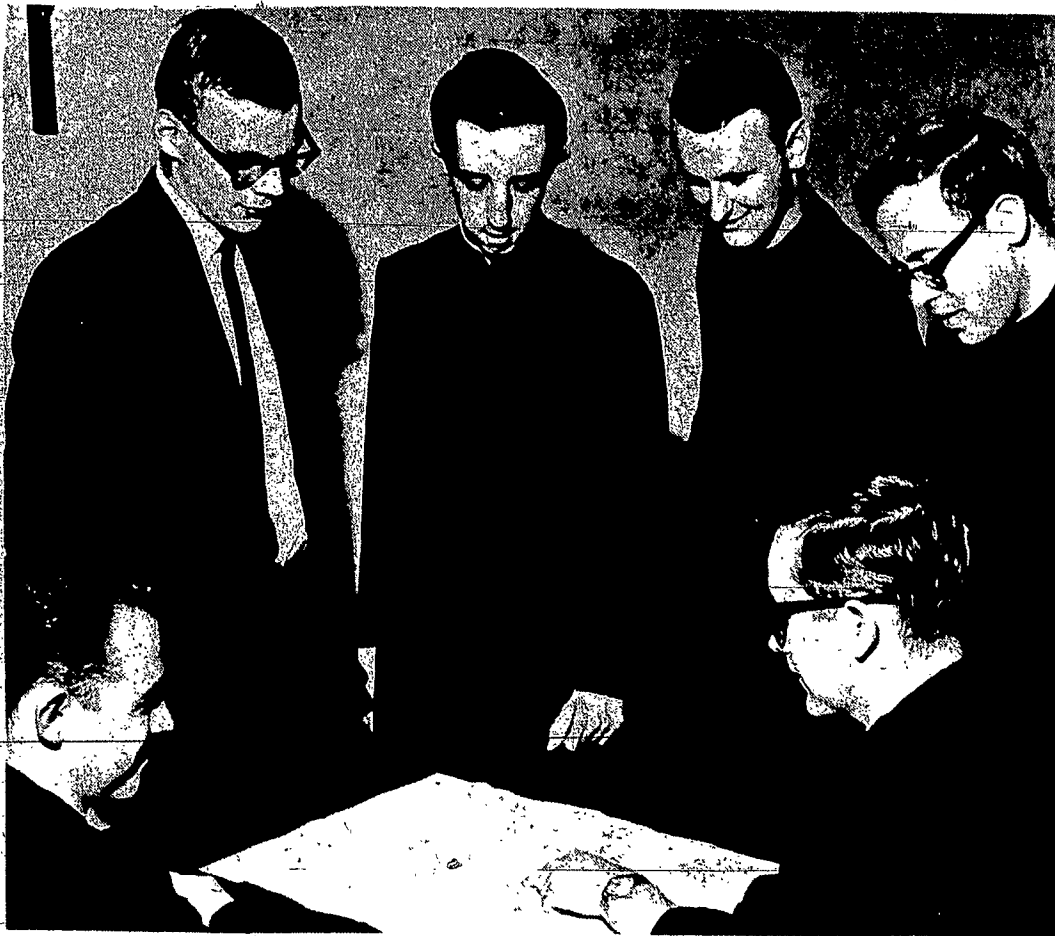

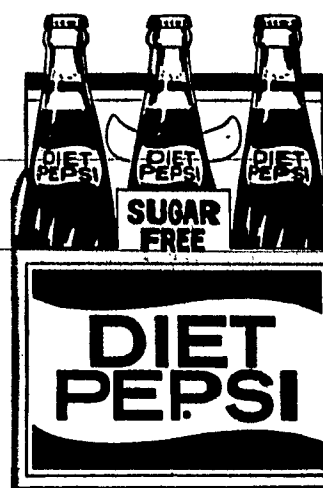

Basilians Off to Missions

Ten scholastics from Rochester have been appointed by the Basilian Fathers for summer catechetical work among the Spanish-speaking peoples of Texas and Mexico.

In making the announcement, Father E. A. Heyck, C.S.B., rector of the Basilian House of Studies, said that eight of the seminarians would work in Texas, covering an area of approximately 10,000 square miles in the Diocese of Galveston-Houston, while two will work in the mission-supported parish

of San Juan Crisostomo near Mexico City.

Going to the Texas missions are: Francis Amico, Edward Bellefeuille, Michael Brand, Walter Gibbons, Jerome Grzywacz, Douglas Mosey, Dennis Ringvetski and Richard Wahl. Two Rochesterians, William Frankenberger and Arthur McCarthy, will teach in Mexico.

Students at St. John Fisher College during the school year, these young men will continue their preparation for the priest-

hood as they gain practical experience in the mission field.

They will work in teams of two at each of the centers joining the regular staff of priests and sisters for the summer catechetical program and they will also assist them in the summer recreational program.

The Basilian Fathers began their missionary activities with the Spanish-speaking people of Texas in 1938 and their field was extended to Mexico in 1961 at the request of the Latin-American bishops.

The missionary work is presently carried on from four centers in Texas and one in Mexico.

Father Heyck noted that most of the scholastics would be particularly prepared for their work by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine program of the diocese of Rochester in which they have been participating.

Fairfield Seminar Lists McAuley Prexy

A Humanities Institute, geared to teachers of grades seven through twelve and administrators, has been scheduled by Fairfield University to run from July 5-July 29, according to Dr. Joseph G. Grassi, associate professor of philosophy at the University and director of the Institute.

The purpose of the institute, which will be conducted in a lecture-seminar format, will be to allow "group exploration of the function of the human being in terms of the problems confronting him in the modern world." The Institute director explained that the program will function "to elicit consideration of the role of man rather than to provide definitive answers."

Sister Mary Petrus, president of Rochester's McAuley College will conduct a seminar on liter-

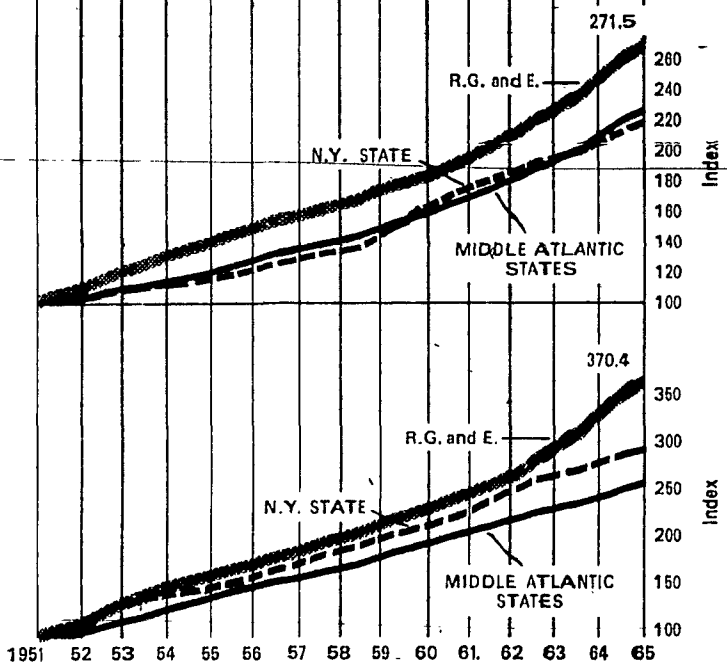
ature, entitled "The Artist's Search for the Meaning of Man."

In addition to the regularly scheduled lectures and seminars, special lectures in art, music, and drama will be offered.

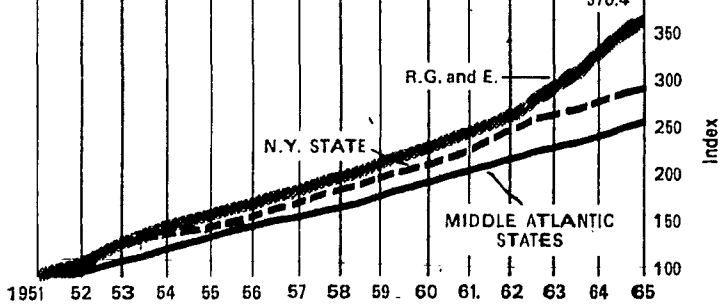
