Nazareth, Fisher Plan Record Summer Session

A record enrollment is anticipated for the St. John Fisher-Nazareth College 1966 Summer Session. Preliminary registration of Fisher students for the summer term is already more than fifty per cent higher than a year ago. Four hundred forty-eight students from seventy-four colleges and universities in the United States and Canada attended summer courses at St. John Fisher last year.

A teaching staff of approximately sixty men and women will present more than one hundred courses in the combined offerings of the two colleges. All courses at both institutions are coeducational. Nazareth will conduct day and evening sessions at both undergraduate and graduate levels over a six-week period commencing June 25. At Fisher, in addition to the regular six-week day and evening session, there will be two five-week day and evening terms for which a full year of credit may be earned. The five-week sessions begin June 13 and July 14. Lectures for the six-week term start June 27.

Dormitory accommodations are available at Nazareth for women and at St. John Fisher for men. A series of extracurricular social and cultural activities has been planned by the Summer Session directors.

Of particular interest to teachers is a series of special education courses in the Fisher course schedule. Among these are:

"Linguistics and the Teaching of Reading in the Elementary Schools," to be taught by Dr. Julian Granberry, associate professor of anthropology at Fisher;

"Teacher and Public Relations," offered by Dr. Donald M. Tower, retired president of the State University College at Brockport;

"Psychology and Education of the Exceptional Child" and "Educational Psychology," both to be taught by Dr. Harold Schwartz, staff member at Jefferson High School and the DePaul Clinic;

"Methods of Teaching Social Studies in Secondary Schools," by Dr. Charles Meder, former head of the teacher education
