### Mooney Takes League Title

Greece Arcadia, Churchville, Batavia, and Bishop Kearney all fell last week to Cardinal Mooney High School baseball team as the Cardinals extended their winning streak to 19 straight games. Mooney, by virtue of its win over Bishop Kearney, took the Catholic High School baseball crown.

Cardinal Mooney clinched the Rochester Catholic High School title by defeating Bishop Kearney 2-0 on the Kings diamond. A crowd of about 300 spectators watched a terrific pitching duel between Mooney's Jim Butler and Kearney's Rip Coleman. Butler in winning his 8th game of the season without a loss, gave up 5 hits while striking out 12 and walking 0. Coleman gave up 3 hits while fanning 19 and walking 3.

The Cardinals got two runs in the 3rd inning when with one out, Kevin Dugan walked, Terry Murphy, Cardinal second baseman, then came up and hit a drive deep to right center that went for a home run and gave the Cardinals a 2-0 lead.

Mooney scored again in the 4th as catcher Bill Walker doubled, then scored on Butler's looping single into short center.

Jim Wallace, a curve ball specialist, handcuffed Arcadia with 3 hits as Mooney won game number 13 by a score of 3-1. Wallace struck out 10 to win his third game against no defeats. Terry Murphy's single drove in 2 runs to ice the game.

A big 9 run first inning helped Jim Butler notch his 7th straight win without a loss as Mooney defeated Churchville

11-0. Butler struck out 10 while walking 1 and giving up 3 hits. Jim Nealon, Cardinal third sacker, hit 2 doubles while Tom Hayes and Kevin Dugan each contributed 2 singles.

Ken Harrington turned in his finest pitching performance to date as he gave up 2 hits while striking out 13 as the Cardinals defeated Batavia 2-0 under the lights at MacArthur Stadium. Terry Murphy paced the offensive attack with a double and single in three trips to the plate. Jim Nealon's single in the 6th drove in the decisive

### McQuaid Track 9-2

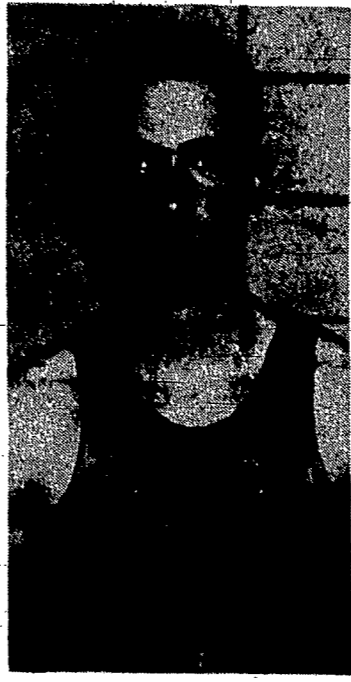
McQuaid's track and field men raised their record to 9-2 last week with victories over formidable competition from the county league. On Wednesday at Brighton, the Knights rallied from a 20-point deficit in the field events and won going away, 69-49. On Friday, in a quadrangular meet headed by unbeaten Irondequoit, McQuaid made up a 22-point field events deficit and topped the Indians, as well as Penfield and Edison.

Against Brighton, Chuck Maier and Mark Boylan teamed up for a 1-2 in the 440, with Maier's time of 52.9 setting a school record. John Campolieto scored his first dash victory of the season in the 220.

Bill Norton ran anchor leg on McQuaid's winning mile relay team, hanging on to win by a few inches in the best race of the day. Pete Sear accounted for another school record (and a broken pole) with an 11-8 vault against Brighton's Darrell Stigter, who wound up with 192, best in the county this season.

In the quadrangular, McQuaid got record performances from Rockwell (20.5 in the hurdles) and Kendrick (1:58.3 half-mile) as well as wins from Fahy (220), Maier (440), Pat Love (2 mile), and the 880-relay team.

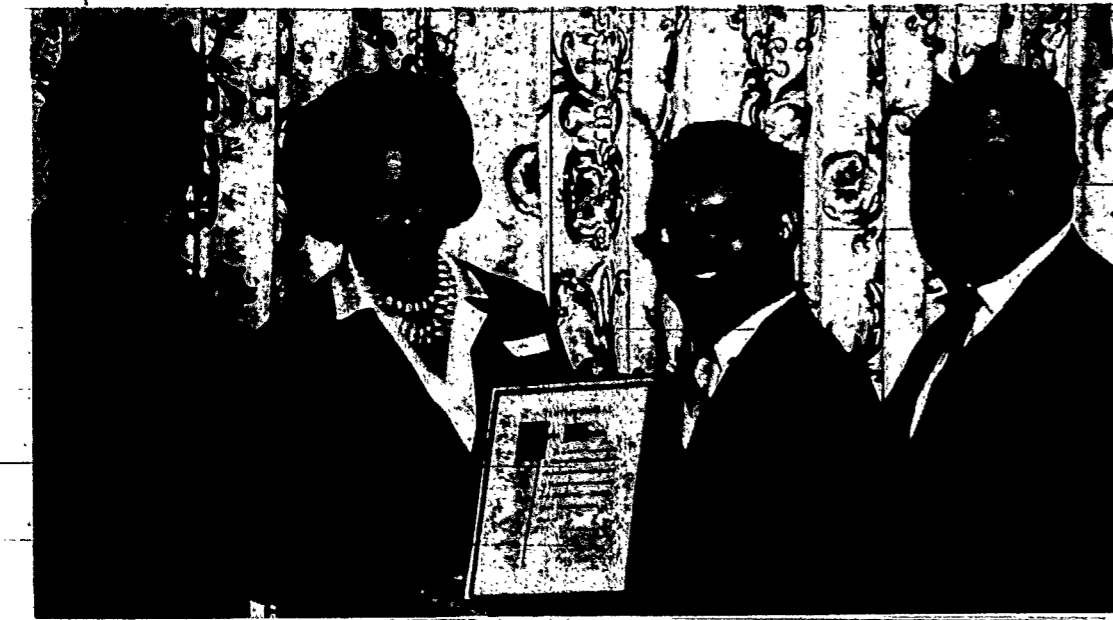
### Diocesan Track Meet June 4 at McQuaid
