**LeMoynes Cites Boston Cardinal Greets Fr. Borgognoni**  
 Father Charles Borgognoni, chaplain for students at Syracuse University, will receive an honorary degree this Sunday (June 5) from LeMoynes College.

Father Borgognoni, a graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary in Rochester (1949) will be given a Doctorate of Humane Letters at LeMoynes' Commencement exercises. The event is scheduled for the Syracuse War Memorial.

**Boston — (RNS) — A day of Christian "unity of love" — if not full organizational unity — was heralded here by Cardinal Cushing as he greeted commissioners (delegates) to the 178th General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A.**

The popular Catholic prelate, who received warm applause at his appearance and an extended standing ovation after his brief remarks, addressed the Protestant group as "dearly loved fellow Christians" and "brothers in Christ."

"God bless you all," he said, raising his arms to the gathering of 838 delegates and several hundred visitors.

The cardinal's arrival at the War Memorial Auditorium was characteristically informal. Instead of using the front entrance, where Assembly officials planned to meet him, he entered alone at a back door and walked toward the speaker's platform. Quickly spotted, he ushered onto the platform by Dr. Eugene Carson Blake, United Presbyterian chief administrator.

Cardinal Cushing, wearing the simple black suit and collar of a priest, expressed enthusiastic gratitude for the end of the day when "we all lived in our own ghettos . . . hardly spoke to one another and surely we did not know one another."

He noted that a short year ago it could "hardly be expected" that a prelate of the Catholic Church would be addressing an official policy-making body of Protestants.

Today, the cardinal went on, "the picture has changed. We pray together, we have Bible vigils together, we meet socially and we engage in friendly dialogue.

"We are on the way to present a united front to a world beset by problems."

**St. Anthony Festival Set In Charlotte**

Religious ceremonies, a parade and fireworks display will mark the 54th Annual Celebration of St. Anthony's Feast in Charlotte on Saturday, June 11.

The Festival will open at 9 a.m. with a High Mass at Holy Cross Church, 4492 Lake Avenue with Father Robert H. Fennessy, celebrant. Following Mass, a procession of church organizations will proceed to the St. Anthony Shrine on Church grounds for ceremonies.

Over 35,000 people are expected to view and participate in the annual festival which promises to be the greatest in years.

Smart stepping bands and drum corps, colorful floats and bright marching units will provide a treat for the parade enthusiasts.

The annual parade will begin at 6:45 p.m. at Charlotte High School and Hewitt Street, proceed to Lake Avenue and north to Ontario Beach Park. 70 units will be represented, with over 2500 persons in the line of march.

Police advise spectators to plan on arriving by 6 p.m. to avoid the last minute traffic jam. Plenty of parking is available at Ontario Beach.

Participating bands will include Aquinas, Bishop Kearney, Holley Hawks, Nazareth, Barnard City Bagpipe, Holy Cross, Blue Angels, Alpine Girls, Shoreliners, plus other drum and bugle corps, drill teams, local clubs and organizations, floats, Scouting and Little League groups, headed by Princess Red Wing.

Reigning over the Festival this year is St. Anthony's Queen Connie Jackson, along with Alternate Queen Francine Pecararo. They will ride on a float along the Lake Avenue parade route. Other area Queens expected to attend are the Monroe County, Greece and Irondequoit Harvest Queens.

A reviewing stand will be set up north of Holy Cross Church. City and local dignitaries are expected to attend. Trophies will be awarded to the best marching groups in each division.

A gigantic fireworks display will start at 10 p.m. fired over Ontario Beach. A great finale is expected including shooting rockets, a tribute to the U.S. flag and our Country.

Rain date for parade and fireworks will be Sunday, June 12.

**Confusion A Picnic!**

Hobart, Australia. —(NC)—Current confusion in the Church, though disturbing, is like "an altar boys' picnic" compared to the turmoil of the past, Archbishop Guilford Young of Hobart told a group of Catholic educators here.

The prelate said that the bishops of the Vatican council would know that their decisions would bring them many headaches, both from reactionary backlash and from others who would go too far.

Archbishop Young said that the process of change would have to move with accelerating speed if the impetus of the council were not to be lost. He said the power of reform could be lost unless the council goals were achieved in the next 10 to 15 years.
