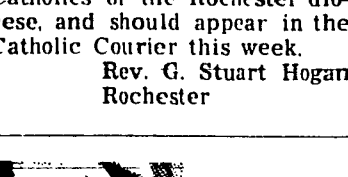
Couples from St. Ann's Parish Christian Family Movement (CFM) did this recently, and agreed that the film added a new dimension to their understanding of Christ. "Here is an intense, driven man, not at all mid-mannered and effeminate as popular religious art sometimes suggests. He aggressively bargains his listeners (and us). The familiar words of the sermon on the mount seem, not comforting, but frightening. One fears that perhaps Christ really meant it when he said, "You, therefore must be perfect even as your heavenly Father is perfect."



Another couple felt that Christ's completely believable humanity led them to a greater appreciation of his divinity. "Would any other 'angry young man' going about airing his grievances against society, have done so well in terms of his followers? A great awareness of his divinity came to us through this drama of Jesus' humanity."



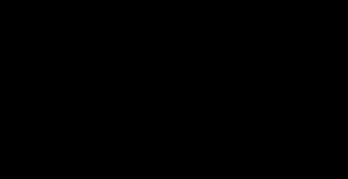
The strong character of all the figures, revealed by close-up shots in the film impressed another couple. "They are very real, filled with emotions: love, fear, pain, sorrow. Christ's message for them is a way of living rather than of achieving some ultimate goal or state of perfection." "The moments of silence were often more impressive than the rapid dialogue."

Noted Jesuit At Cornell Graduation

Ithaca — Rev. John Courtney Murray, S.J., theologian, author and scholar at Vatican Council II, preached the annual Baccalaureate Sermon for Cornell University graduates at solemn exercises Sunday, June 12.

The first Catholic clergyman ever chosen in the 101-year history of Cornell to deliver the Baccalaureate, Father Murray will speak on "This Age of Renewal." An audience of close to 5,000 graduates, faculty, parents and friends of the Class of '66 will hear the distinguished Jesuit priest.

Father Murray received an M.A. in Boston College, and taught in the Philippines before earning his Doctorate of Theology at the Gregorian University in Rome. He has been teaching for nearly 25 years at the Jesuit's Woodstock Seminary in Maryland.

The Cornell graduating class of nearly 1,800 includes 245 Catholics, according to Rev. Richard Torrey, chaplain at the university. They will attend Mass of Thanksgiving at 9 o'clock in Anabel Taylor Hall's St. Thomas Aquinas Chapel before the University's Baccalaureate exercises at 11 a.m. Father Murray will say the Mass and Father Torrey give the sermon.

St. Louis — (RNS) — The God-is-dead movement is beneficial insofar as "it makes people think," according to Joseph Cardinal Ritter, Archbishop of St. Louis.

Speaking before the Press Club of Metropolitan St. Louis, Cardinal Ritter said he did not find the God-is-dead movement "unduly disturbing."

"It is one way of awakening people to the need for a commitment to religion," he said. "It makes everybody think, and it is a challenge to us, that is, those of us who might be called the professional religionists."

In commenting on the Catholic Church's ban against marriage for priests, Cardinal Ritter said a reevaluation of the policy was under way and re-

Baptism, Door to Church, Points to Need for Unity

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Paul VI, speaking at his regular midweek general audience in St. Peter's Basilica, stressed that all baptized persons "are members of the church, even if they are brothers separated from the Catholic unity."

Devoting his address to the concept of belonging to the church, the Pope said that "true unity is the deeply felt need of the religious order established by Christ."

"The church is one and unique," he stated. "There are not many churches as such and sufficient to themselves. The sovereign law of unity closely rules the religious society founded by our Lord."

"It is towards this perfect and organic unity and the overcoming of obstacles in the way of full ecclesiastical communion that our ecumenical movement tends."

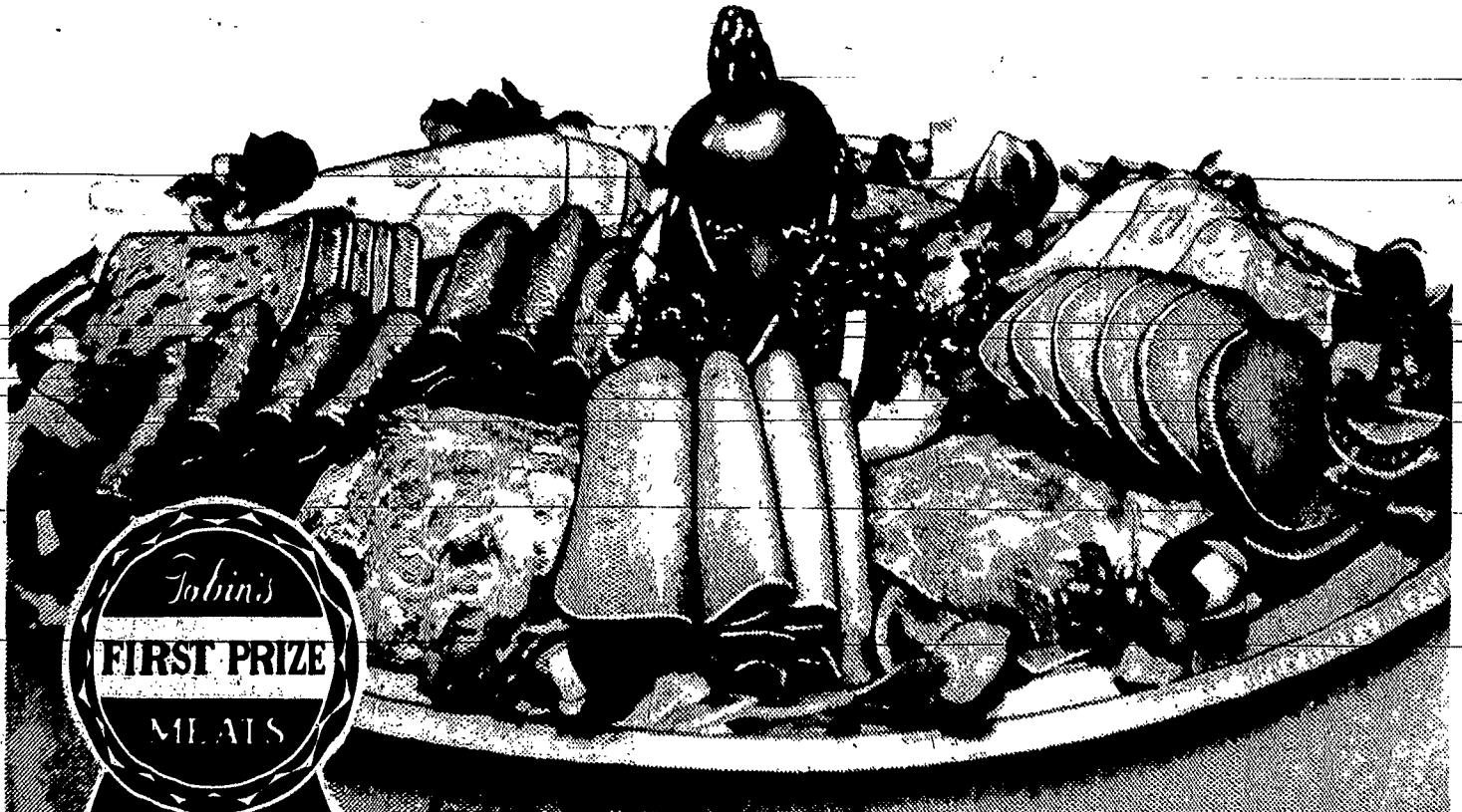
The pontiff went on to speak of how people can belong to the church — by membership or by their desire as catechumens, and "even by an honest way and outlook on life without explicit Christian knowledge."

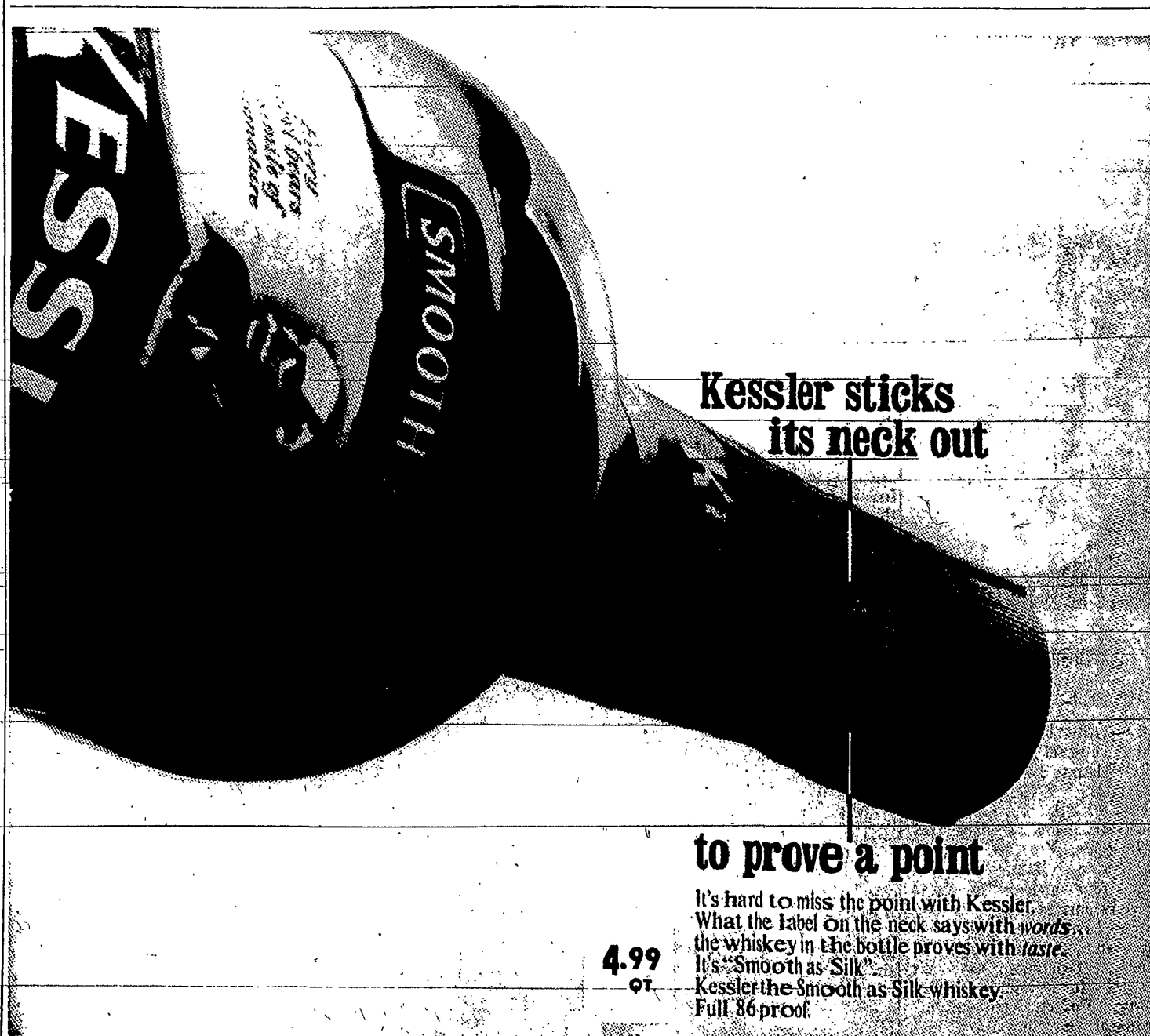
