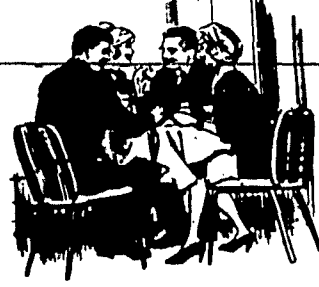

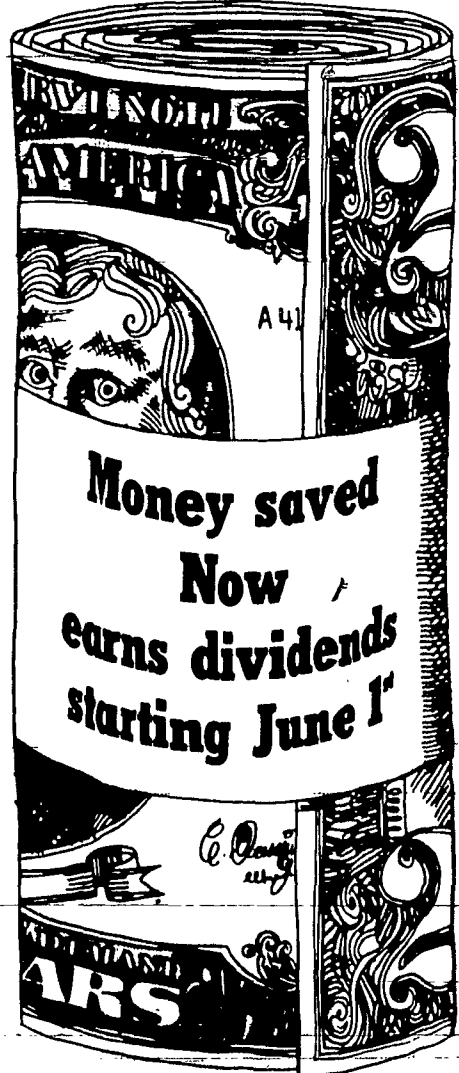

Mother of Sorrows

Historic Cemetery To Be Preserved

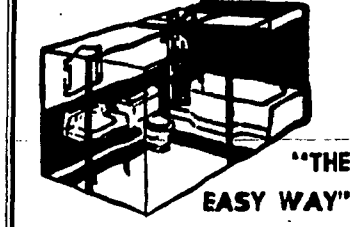
The historic cemetery adjoining Mother of Sorrows Church, 5000 Mt. Road Boulevard will be put in order and preserved as a part of the new church plan, Father George S. Wood pastor said today.

The parish has an appeal each year on the Sunday prior to Memorial Day for the upkeep and preservation of this oldest Catholic cemetery between Albany and Buffalo.

When Mother of Sorrows was established in 1829 for the people of the area and for those who came to America from Ireland a parish cemetery was part of the setup.

surviving the deceased. A great majority of the graves are not marked," Father Wood said.

Irish-American history is recorded on many of the stones. One stone mentions that the parish was started in 1829 as St. Ambrose Parish and in 1860 was changed to Our Mother of Sorrows. A marker indicates that a Felix McGuire brought the Catholic faith from Ireland to Monroe County.

Father Wood said that any information about unmarked plots would be appreciated.

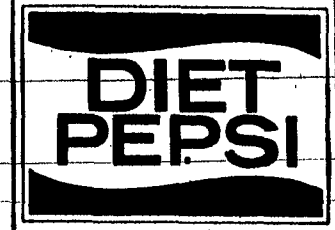

Priest Awarded Research Grant

A Rochester priest and Aquinas Institute graduate has been awarded a highly-coveted graduate research fellowship at Arizona State University.

Father Edward Wajda, an Aquinas graduate of 1945 and son of Mr. and Mrs. Roman Wajda of 173 Wakefield St., has received the fellowship for the coming school year.

Recipients of the University Graduate Research Fellowships receive a stipend of \$2,800 for nine months.

Father Wajda, who is majoring in English, holds a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Toronto and a master of arts degree from the University of Rochester. He is a priest of the Diocese of Tucson, Arizona.

The research project of Father Wajda, who plans to teach on the college level, includes a study of 17th Century English literature, with special emphasis on the Phoenix as a literary device.

Father Wajda is a brother to Father Fred Wajda, C.S.B., head of the English department at Aquinas Institute.

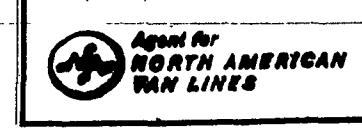
