He is survived by two brothers and three sisters.

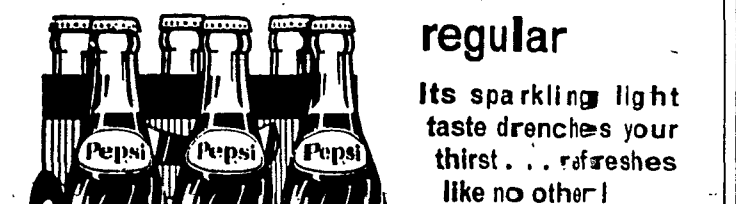
