# Fifty Seven Priests Given New Duties

### **Three Named To Pastorates**

Bishop Kearney assigned 57 priests of the Rochester Diocese to new duties this week.

The appointments include:

• A veteran pastor named pastor emeritus.

• Another pastor assigned to special diocesan work.

• Three priests appointed pastors.

• Nineteen priests are given special duties.

• Seventeen assistant pastors are transferred to other parishes.

• Sixteen newly ordained priests are given their first parish assignments.

The Bishop also appointed eight deacons who will be ordained to the priesthood next year to assist in parishes of the Diocese during the summer months.

All the appointments are effective Tuesday, June 28, at 6 p.m.







He launched the program in 1950.



The whole Church, he continued, must work to bring


