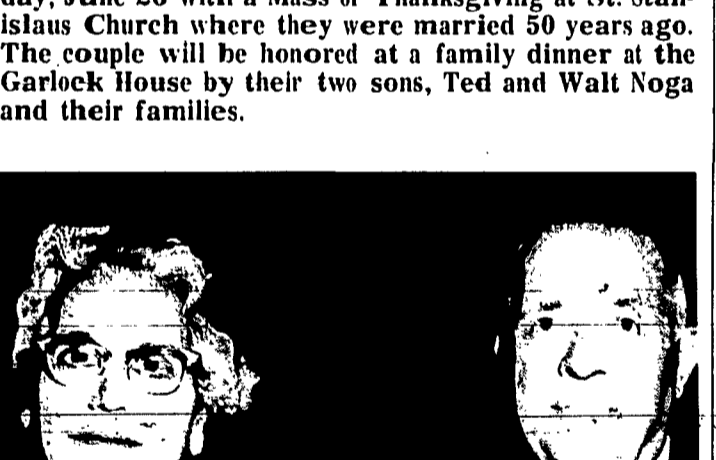

Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Arrangements by Alvah Haloran and Son Funeral Home.

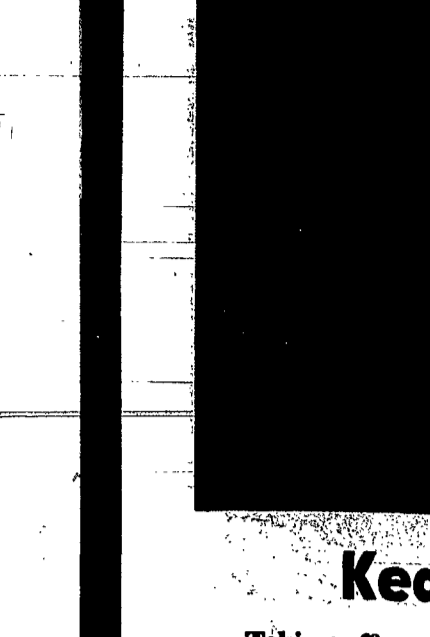
## 25 Years Ago
