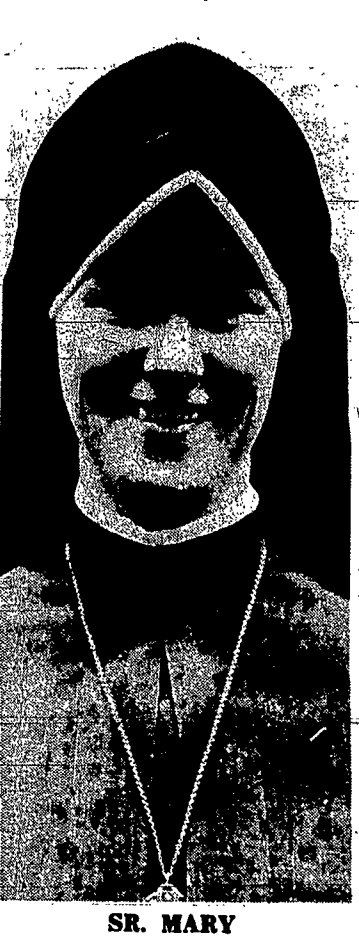

### 25 Years Ago

(From Catholic Courier files, July 3, 1941)

Bishop Kearney celebrated Solemn Pontifical Mass for 12,000 attending the Catholic Students Mission Crusade 12th Convention at an outdoor altar in Red-Wing Stadium. Members of the hierarchy, priests, nuns and delegates braved record heat to participate.

C.S.M.C. Delegates in resolution at convention "deplored any and all measures denying to our fellow Negro Americans the right and opportunity to be of full service to their country" and stressed the need for friendly relations with Latin America.

Willard A. Marakle, 74, first editor of the Catholic Journal and a distinguished layman died. A secular newspaperman, he became assistant Industrial Commissioner of the State Labor Department.

### Chemung Campaign Aims at \$649,967

The goal for the 1966 United Community Chest-Red Cross Campaign in Chemung County will be \$649,967. This sum was announced last week by Lawrence Schuler, Chest President, as the target of the United Campaign scheduled for early fall. In 1965, a total of \$628,613 was raised. The goal for the following drive represents an increase of \$21,354 or 3.5 per cent.

Sixteen local agencies and eight national agencies are included in the Community Chest. The Red Cross is a fund raising partner, making a total of 24 appeals in one for the United Campaign. The United Campaign raises funds to meet current operating needs of its member agencies, but does not provide for new buildings and capital fund drives.

The goal of \$649,967 was approved by the Community Chest Board upon the recommendation of the Chest Budget Committee. This committee, under the chairmanship of Thomas Milligan, 1st Vice President of the Community Chest, analyzed the budget of each agency and recommended a preliminary amount to be included in the goal for each participating agency.
