

French Film Rated 'C'

New York—The National Catholic Office for Motion Pictures evaluated the French-made movie "Le Bonheur" in its Class C (condemned) category because of "serious moral problems," scenes of love-making and "numerous instances of nudity."

The NCMP posted the following objection against the movie:

"Despite its extraordinary visual beauty this film presents serious moral problems both in theme and in treatment."

"The theme that happiness consists in submitting to the order of nature, where 'nature' means exclusively the inclination of the senses, is patently immoral and unrealistic. If the

director intends the contrary, any ironic commentary implied is much too subtle to be grasped by the normally perceptive viewer.

"In treatment the explicit goes beyond the limits of decency."

Villages for Slum Children

Buenos Aires—(NC)—Many homeless Argentine children are now enjoying a better life in a children's village founded here by Father Carlos E. Gardella in 1961.

Father Gardella is chaplain of the Argentine federal police and has devoted a quarter of a century to improving the welfare of children. He has visited centers for children in Italy, Switzerland, Spain, France, and Austria, and his children's village is based on the one built by Herman Gmeiner at Innsbruck, Austria, in 1949 to provide homes for war orphans.

Father Gardella's village accepts Argentine orphans and

slum children abandoned by their parents and provides them with a family atmosphere.

His present children's village consists of two houses made from old tram cars. Each house is constructed of three cars joined to form functional living quarters, including kitchens, bedrooms, dining areas, and bathrooms.

Each house is occupied by nine children and a woman who serves as their mother. The "mother" not only cooks and cleans and sews, but also gives them affection.

The "mothers" are helped by another woman in the project known as the children's "aunt." Father Gardella will open his

second children's village soon near the small town of Garin. It will consist of six modern brick houses and a larger community house presided over by a village director and his wife. The director will act as a "father."

As they do here in the Vicente Lopez village, the children in Garin will attend school and church in the town, in order that their lives may be integrated with those of other children.

Father Gardella said that children's villages are spreading throughout Latin America. There are already such villages in Ecuador and Uruguay, and Brazil and Peru will soon have children's villages, he said.

Democracy For Missions

Boston—(RNS)—Priest members of the Missionary Society of St. James the Apostle will elect their superiors under a constitutional amendment approved by the Catholic order's directors here.

The society was founded in 1958 by Cardinal Cushing of Boston, and sends diocesan priests to Latin American missions. It now has 100 members recruited internationally.

Under the revision, society members for at least one year will vote for their Superior General and for the three regional superiors in Peru, Bolivia and Ecuador.

Other changes by the society included nomination of a full-time recruiting officer, publication of a newsletter to aid promotion and public relations, and insertion of the word "international" in literature describing the order.
