The youngsters' mother died recently; their father is a political prisoner, unable to provide support for his children.

All three were pupils of Catholic schools in Salisbury, the nation's capital.

### Prelate Backs Workers In Texas Farm Strike

Brownsville, Texas—(NC)—Archbishop Robert E. Lucey of San Antonio deplored "starvation wages" paid to farm workers in his sermon at the enthronement of Bishop Humberto Medeiros of Brownsville here.

The archbishop pledged his support of the month-old strike of the Rio Grande City valley farm workers for higher wages and improved working conditions.

"It is the clear and constant teaching of the Church that labor must be organized and strikes sometimes necessary," the archbishop said. "This teaching is dangerous heresy to businessmen who are blind to the necessity of labor organization."
