New State Champions

Aquinas institutes high-stepping color guard captured the New York State Championship last Saturday in Albany. The annual competition, sponsored by the American Legion in conjunction with the Legion's state convention, drew the top color guards and musical units of the state. The 16-man Aquinas Guard finished first with a score of 98.8 out of a possible 100 points—two full points ahead of the second place Titans of Frankfort, N.Y. The Wildcats of Marcellus, N.Y. finished third, 500 of a point behind the Titans. Twenty guards from the state competed for the coveted crown at Beverwyck Park in Albany. Receiving high praise from the judges were Aquinas' three twirling rifles composed of Kevin Brinkman, Don Brookins and Tom Brady. Color guard captain Dave Behr, a June graduate of Aquinas, received a nearly perfect score for his performance. This marks the first time that a guard from Western New York has taken the state championship. Last year Aquinas finished third. The Crusader's color guard took first place in the senior division. In drill team competition the Webster Highlanders came in first.
