

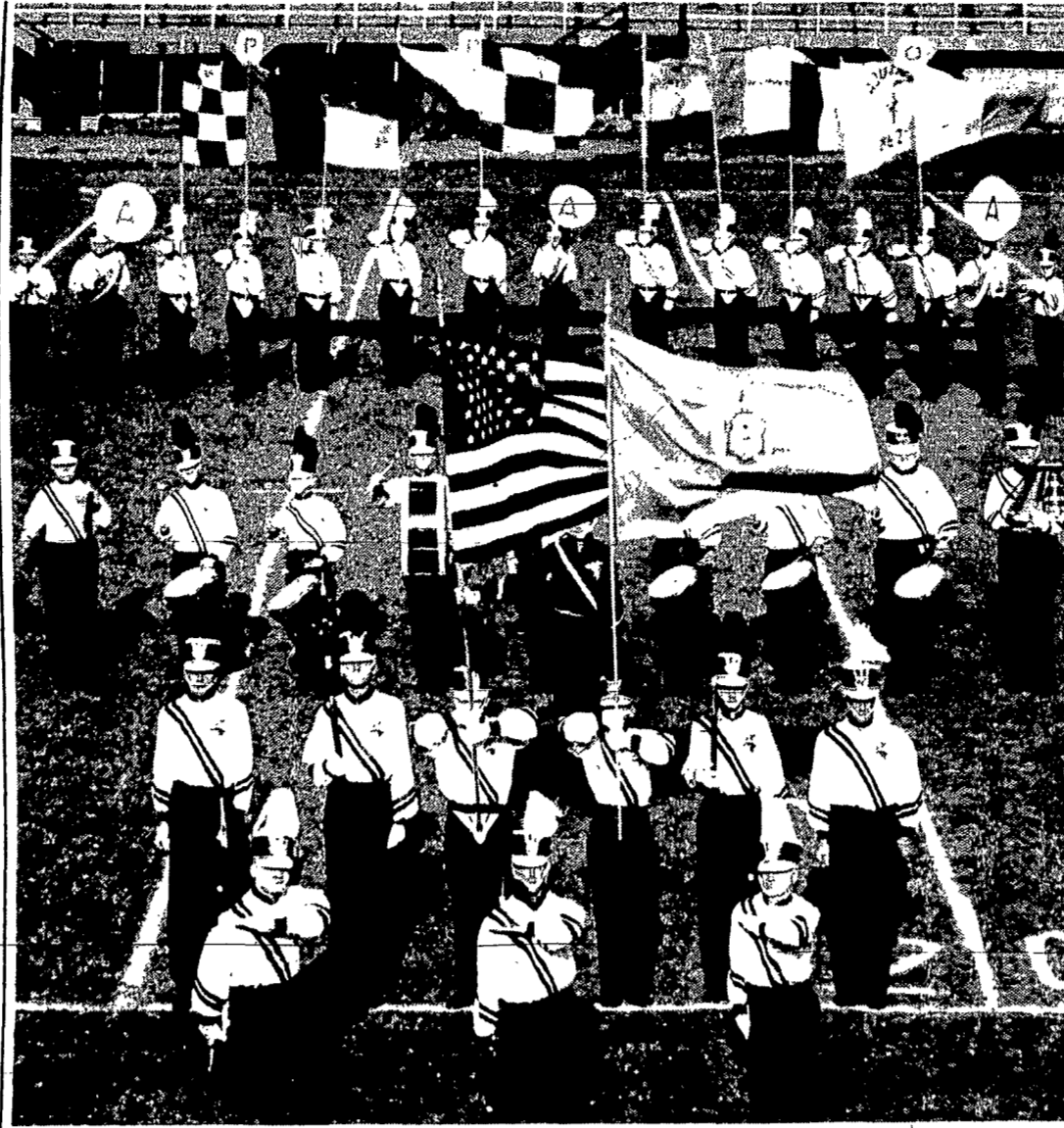

Aquinas Students In Washington

If President Johnson takes a stroll through the White House gardens on August 28 he will have an opportunity to view the precision and snap of the Aquinas Institute Color Guard.

The occasion will be the annual color guard contest sponsored by the American Legion in conjunction with the Legion's national convention. This year the veterans' organization will meet in Washington, D.C.

The 17-man Aquinas contingent is presently rated tops as contender for the national crown. Currently the boys have captured all local honors and last month won the New York State championship in Albany.

Resplendent in uniforms of white, red and black, the Aquinas guard thrill audiences as they perform precision drills while wheeling and turning in fluid patterns in spectacular fashion.

David Behr, a June graduate and four-year member of the guard, serves as color guard captain. In several competitions during the winter season he was awarded trophies for his individual performance.

Drawing as much attention from audiences as the colorful flags are the rifle twirlers. A trio consisting of Kevin Brinkman, Don Brookins and Tom Brady draw gasps as they send their rifles high into the air and catch them in perfect unison, much to the delight of the crowds.
