Laity Meeting in Rome in 1967

Washington — (NC) — The National Council of Catholic Men and the National Council of Catholic Women have been appointed as the United States coordinating committee to form a national delegation for the Third World Congress of the Lay Apostolate to be held in Rome, Oct. 11 to 18, 1967.

Announcement of the appointment was made by Archbishop Leo Binz of St. Paul, episcopal chairman of the Department of Lay Organizations, N.Y. at a Catholic Welfare Conference.

The NCCW and the NCCM will be responsible for preparations for the World Congress and will handle applications for appointments as delegates.

The official national delegations to the congress will be composed of a maximum of 30 persons per country, of whom six may be non-lay people. There will also be a limited number of experts and auditors. The delegation will be representative of various aspects of the lay apostolate.

The essential aim of this post-conciliar congress will be to stimulate and develop the apostolic activity of the laity in the light of the teachings of the Second Vatican Council and in relation to the problems and aspirations of modern man.

The theme of the Third World Congress for the lay Apostolate will be "God's People on Man's Journey." The theme will be dealt with in lectures, brief statements, panel discussions and in two series of workshops.

Part I will be devoted to "Man Today," and will treat of the joys, hopes, griefs and anxieties of the men of this age.

Part II will be on "God's Call." In this session, participants will reflect on the call which God addresses to every man through human experiences, on the call to work for the salvation of his fellow men; and finally on the vocation of God's people.
