

LBJ War Critics Called 'One Sided'

New York — (RNS) — President Johnson feels that criticism of U.S. policy in Vietnam by the World Council on Church and Society in Geneva was "one-sided," White House Press Secretary Bill Moyers said on a CBS radio network program.

In an interview with CBS Correspondent Robert Pierpont, Moyers said the President "understands why men of the cloth particularly condemned aggression, in his judgment," the press secretary went on, "ought to take into account that the other side is the provocateur of aggression in South Vietnam."

Moyers expressed doubt that the increasing influence of churchmen from Iron Curtain countries and newly emerging nations was a prime factor in the "heavy criticism" of U.S. Vietnam policy.

"I think," he said, "that the most important criteria that the Geneva conference adopted was simply a general hostility to war on the part of clergymen."

"Unfortunately," he added, "in this case, there was a lack of acquaintance with the facts in Southeast Asia. I think that too often clergymen express opposition on the basis of a moral principle without regard to the facts involved and I think that happened in this case."

Responding to criticism of U.S. practices in Vietnam from churchmen in general, Moyers said that President Johnson "feels strongly that ministers and clergymen have an obligation to stand as prophets and judges but their judgments ought to fall not unilaterally but multilaterally on all the parties responsible."

The Pine City Marching Band will give a concert at 3 p.m. followed by Vespers and Benediction at 6 p.m.

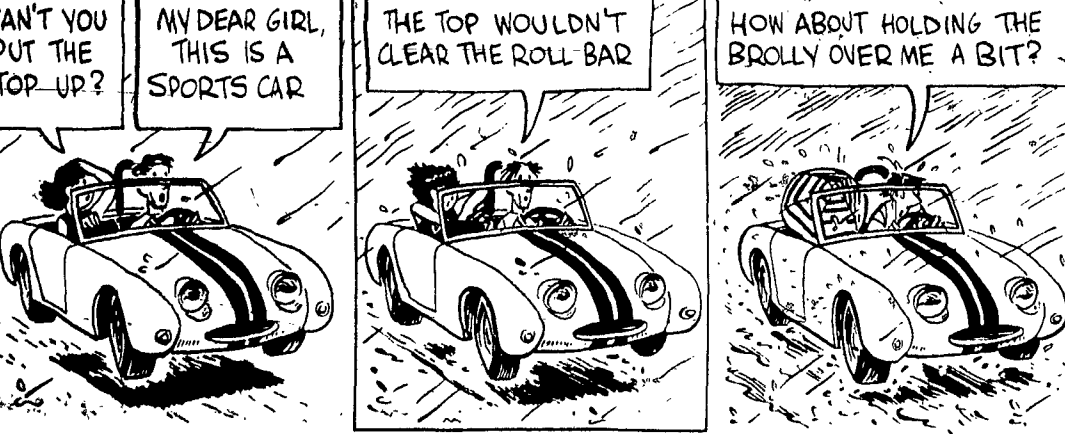
The public is invited. Proceeds of the day help support the monks during the year.
