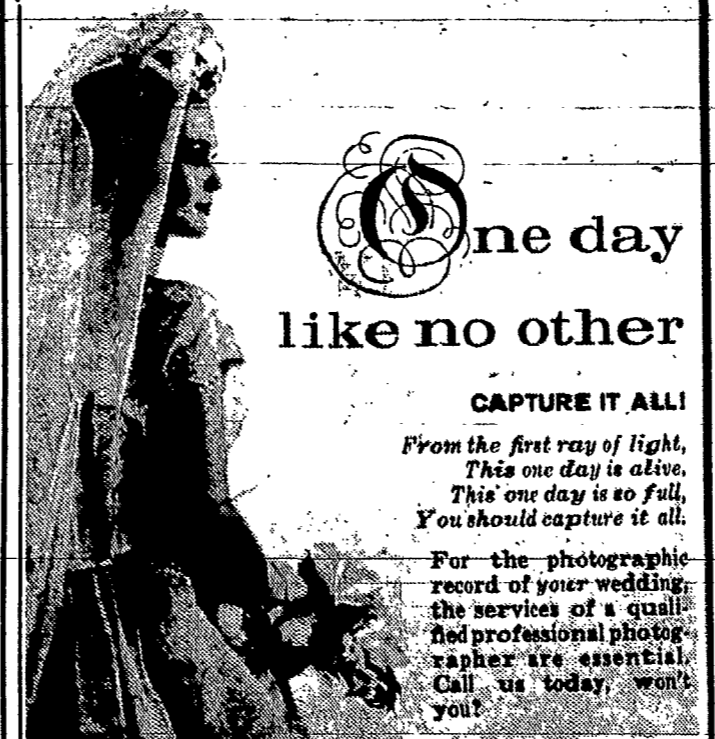

Non-Catholics Welcomed As Extension Volunteers

Chicago—From now on, non-Catholics will be eligible for service with the Extension Volunteers, Father John J. Sullivan, National Director, has announced. The new policy was approved by diocesan directors and faculty representatives during several regional meetings held in late April and early May.

Non-Catholic volunteers will be assigned primarily to inner-city work and as aides to college chaplains. Father Sullivan said several chaplains have requested non-Catholic volunteers and others have insisted that recruiting on their campuses be extended to students of all faiths. A few applications from non-Catholics were received this year and they are being processed now.

"Vatican II urged cooperation with non-Catholics in projects for social improvement," Father Sullivan said. "Many theologians have noted that one of our main tasks now is to go beyond dialogue with those of other faiths and engage in a crucial dialogue between Christianity and the world at large. We feel that non-Catholic volunteers will be especially important in this area," he added.
