Aquinas Opens Grid Year Next Week; Looks Good

The push-up period is over for Aquinas Institute's Little Irish football players. This week the pads went on and contact drills started as the schoolboys underwent their earliest contact opening ever. The official opening followed a five-day period of conditioning and calisthenics which Aquinas employed since August 24. These drills, however, were strictly informal with no contact or pads.

Aquinas coach Bob Rosmarino has an optimistic outlook as he prepares his charges for the season opener against Mont Pleasant at Schenectady, Saturday, Sept. 17, under the lights at Aquinas Memorial Stadium.

Last year, Rosmarino's first at Aquinas, the Irish compiled a 6-2 record, including a 13-6 victory over the Red Raiders at Schenectady. Many standouts from last season's top-rated squad are graduated including Quarterback Craig Englerth, backfield men Pat DiNicola, Greg Manley, Ray Shea and linemen Mike Sloane, Jim Popen, George Kermit, Dick Gorzynski.

While the losses are heavy, Rosmarino can count on a number of juniors from Frank (Hunk) Vadas' fine junior varsity squad of last year.

Some of the key senior performers returning are Fred Rechio, Bob Farrell, Don Hall, Dan Popen, Pat Graham, Tony Brognia, John Basile, Joe Bulsich, Larry Boucher, Paul Milovich, Frank DiVincenzo and Gerry Gugino. Juniors who played last year include Richard Parinello and Derek Rainey.
