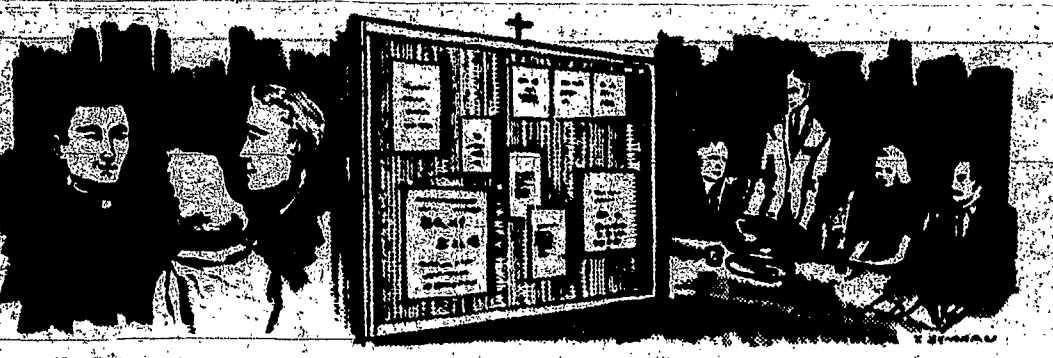

Change is Overdue Segregated Seminaries

Indianapolis — (NC) — A civil rights problems by high echelon discussion is gone. Dr. Robert W. Spike, past director of the Commission on Religion and Race of the National Council of Churches, said he believes top management of business is sincere in its pronouncements of equal opportunity employment, but that there is a "wide gap between the policy-making boards of industry and implementation of that policy on the worker to the needs of the Negro poor."

"The long, long patience of the plundered poor has come to an end," he said. "The problems of the poor Negro cannot be solved by traditional methods."

He called for a broad-based power organization, such as the combined effort of the churches, to force the power structure of the North into a position where they must react level."

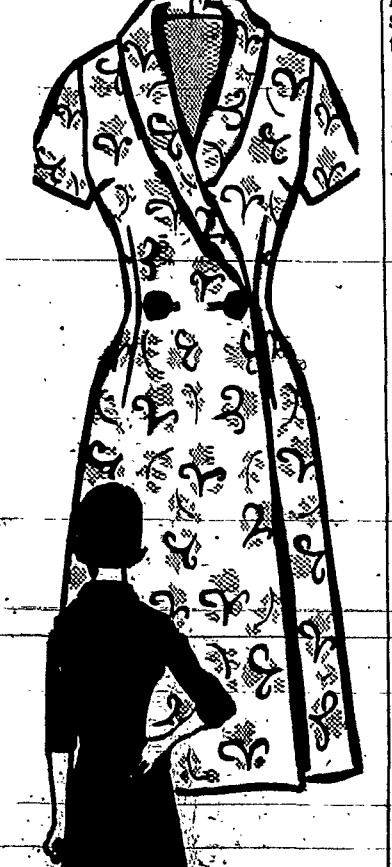
