McQuaid Jesuit High will play host to runners from across the state on October 8 when it stages its second annual invitational cross-country meet.

The meet will include varsity, junior varsity, and junior high divisions, with all races beginning and ending on the McQuaid campus. An innovation in the varsity race will see each school divide its team squad between 2 flights, the lowest combined score determining the winner.

John Williamson is the new football man at Walsh after taking over the reins this year from Matt Conte. For Williamson, a Boston College end for the past three seasons, this will be his first post as head coach.

Early replies indicate a field of over 25 schools from Buffalo to New York City. Defending champion in the varsity class is Brooklyn Prep, a Jesuit school which will be back to seek a second title.

Aquinas Wins Opener

Don Hall scored five touchdowns last Saturday night to bring Aquinas from behind for a 32-14 victory over visiting Mont Pleasant of Schenectady at Aquinas Stadium.

Hall provided the Irish offensive power averaging 106 yards a carry and electrifying the crowd of over 7,000 by runs of 51 and 80 yards.

In all Aquinas gained 418 yards for the game, 58 passing and 358 rushing. Hall accounted for 192 yards. Mt. Pleasant gained 98 yards on the ground.

The Little Irish scored a six-pointer the first time they got the ball on QB Rich Parrone's 11-yard toss to Hall. But then the visitors came alive, surprising Aquinas with a pair of first-half touchdowns and held a 14-6 lead at intermission.

However, the bubble burst for Mont Pleasant in the second half.

AQUINAS, sparked by Halfback Hall, broke loose for four touchdowns in the second half and walked off with a season-opening victory.

The Raiders put over solo touchdowns in the first and second periods. Al Aldi and Joe Barrattiere scored the MP touchdowns. Aldi on an 11-yard pass from QB Pete DiDonato, Barrattiere on a one-yard plunge.

Aquinas won the game on Hall's speed and a vastly improved defense in the second half. Hall scored on plunges of one and two yards, then broke away for gallops of 80 and 11 yards to complete the game scoring.

John Basile converted by kick after two of Hall's TD's for the two Aquinas PATs.

The next stop for Aquinas is Sunday afternoon when it meets cross-city rival McQuaid Jesuit at Aquinas Stadium.

Underdog Mooney Nips McQuaid

An alert Cardinal Mooney eleven, capitalizing on McQuaid's offensive mistakes, opened its season with a 20-10 victory at Aquinas Stadium last Sunday.

This week the Cards will see action on Saturday afternoon, hosting Bishop Walsh of Olean at Aquinas Stadium. McQuaid will seek to rebound against Aquinas on Sunday afternoon at the same site.

Mooney, a slight underdog in the McQuaid game, struck quickly for an apparent score on halfback Dick Parker's 17-yard run, but a holding penalty nullified the play. Minutes later, though, the Cards forced the first of five McQuaid fumbles.

On the next play, quarterback Jim Harrington rifled a pass to end Earl Lenhard, who out-scrambled two Knights for the ball and fell into the end zone for the touchdown.

The score remained 6-0 at halftime as neither side was able to sustain a drive until late in the second quarter when the Knights, led by hard-running Mike Miller, got to the Mooney's only to lose the ball on downs.

Two plays into the second half, the Mooney defense recovered another McQuaid fumble on the Knights' 32. Parker scampered around left end for 20 yards, then went to the opposite side on the same play for the touchdown. Dick Muscolvo added the point for a 13-0 lead.

The Knights finally got going late in the third quarter after a field goal attempt by Muscolvo from 22 yards out fell short. McQuaid launched an 80-yard drive culminating in Steve Hromjak's pass to Bob McRea for 12 yards and a touchdown. Miller knifed over for the point and the quarter ended with Mooney on top, 13-7.

McQuaid's defense found new life then and forced Mooney to punt from its own 45. But Hromjak continued to plague the Knights and the kick wound up in Mooney's hands on McQuaid's 38. Sparked by the scrambling of Harrington, the Cards advanced to the 13, where Harrington hit Lenhard all alone in the end zone. Muscolvo again added the point.

Taking the kickoff, McQuaid struck for its final score on a 67-yard drive in 15 plays. After Miller and Bernie Ashley had picked up 2 first downs, Bob DiPaola sprinted off right tackle for the final 30 yards. The extra-point try failed, and the Cards, with Harrington completing 3 passes to end Gary Braun, held possession until the final whistle.

Outstanding for the Cards were Harrington, who came up with the clutch play time after time; Parker, who gained 97 yards, and Lenhard, who caught 4 passes for 82 yards and 2 TD's. For the Knights, co-captain Miller gained 106 yards rushing and quarterback Hromjak turned in a fine all-around game, including some booming punts. End Dusty Rhodes led the tackling statistics with 15.
