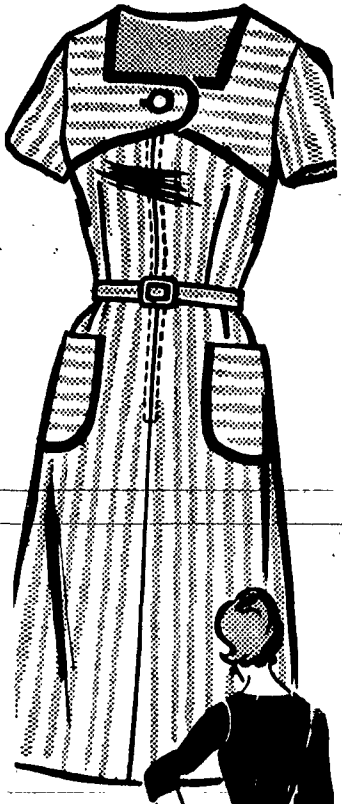

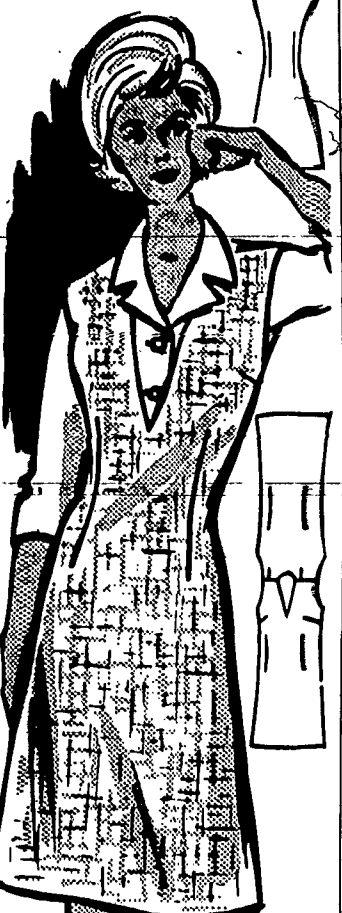

Now a Bishop

Seoul, Korea—(NC)—Twenty years ago Stephen Kim Soohwan, a Korean drafted into the Japanese army, was an American prisoner in the Bonin Islands. Today Stephen Kim Soohwan is bishop of the new diocese of Masan, Korea.

The Japanese government in 1941 insisted that Korean students "volunteer" for the Japanese army. Stephen Kim was pressured to join up, and his family threatened with loss of their ration card if he refused.

In August, 1945, the U.S. Marine Corps took over the Bonin Islands, and by November most of the Japanese were repatriated; Stephen Kim and the other Koreans were held.

As the only English-speaking prisoner, Kim became spokesman. He learned from an American officer that the U.S. hoped to get information on some American pilots known to be prisoners of war on the islands, but who had disappeared.

Young Adults Ask More Changes

Atlanta—(NC)—Planners of an archdiocesan Young Adults Congress have called for a change in the form of confession, a re-examination of the Church's teaching on marriage, "experimental" and all-venacular Masses and elimination of the Friday abstinence law.

The resolutions will be discussed by delegates and voted upon when the congress meets this autumn.

The congress resolutions committee also resolved that a complete list of infallible teachings of the Church be published. It said, "There are very few infallible teachings of the Church. Most Protestants would accept just about all that the Church teaches as infallible in matters of faith except for a few teachings. This would not only help interfaith understanding, but it would also clarify the position of the Catholic layman in the Church."

The Young Adults Congress, called by Archbishop Paul J. Hallinan, follows a lay congress and a congress of Sisters. Their recommendations will culminate in a meeting of the archdiocesan synod in November.

IN ANOTHER series of resolutions on parish and community life, the committee urged young adults to volunteer their services to service organizations, offer their assistance to priests and Religious of their parishes, and support "our bishops in their work to make known all the teachings of Christ of the universal brotherhood of all men."

The committee said the brotherhood of all men does not refer only to movements toward Christian unity, but also to the struggle for social justice and equality.

How to Get Money From Catholics

Oklahoma City — (RNS) — The first annual convention of the recently-formed National Council for Diocesan Support Programs will be held here, Oct. 20-21. The Council is concerned with updating methods in fund raising drives for Catholic diocesan needs.

A major speaker will be Dr. Gilbert G. Stout of Chicago, comptroller of the Methodist General Board of Lay Activities, who will address a dinner on Oct. 20. Clergy and lay diocesan fund raising leaders will hear lectures and participate in workshops on various phases of financial campaigns and the use of mass media for greater support.

President of the Council is Msgr. Joseph C. Walen, editor and general manager of the Western Michigan Catholic in Grand Rapids, who will speak on "The Diocesan Newspaper—Brake or Accelerator?"

Spanish Seminary San Sebastian — (NC) — The San Sebastian diocese's school of theology, closed four months ago because of "student unrest," will reopen in October.

Spanish Group Termed 'Rebels'

Madrid—(NC)—Que Pasa?, a right-wing Spanish newspaper, has revealed the plans of the banned Madrid meeting of Operation Moses, a secret group of progressive priests and laymen.

Releasing the agenda more than a week ahead of its official publication date, Que Pasa? said the Operation Moses group was made up of priests "provoked to subversive" by their participation in the May 11 demonstrations against police brutality in Barcelona.

Ignored by Catholic papers, the conservative journal's story was picked up by most of the secular newspapers, who termed the group "the leaders of open rebellion against the bishops of Spain."

According to the article, Operation Moses wants a strict division between the Church and state in Spain. Specifically they ask that:

- The Church renounces all privileges and protection;
- The Church and clergymen be subject to the same laws governing other institutions and citizens in Spain;
- All clergymen renounce public offices they may be holding;
- Complete freedom of religion be granted in Spain, so that true religious unity may be fostered, and that the current "face of religious solidarity may be abandoned";
- The histories of the Church in Spain be revised to conform with the facts, and that members of the Church show penitence for their sins and errors of judgment;
- The bishops implement immediately the letter and spirit of the Second Vatican Council;
- People realize that if these steps are not taken, there will be a widespread abandonment of the faith by both priests and people;
- There be a new emphasis on brotherhood, rather than on the militarism and nationalism now dominating Spanish thought.

Guidelines For Lutherans

Winnipeg — (RNS) — Guidelines for American Lutheran Church pastors and congregations in their relationships with Roman Catholics at the community level were issued here by the denomination's Church Council.

Citing a "new atmosphere of mutual respect and confidence," the position paper said ecumenical activity is possible in such areas as group dialogue, religious services and cooperative efforts to serve the community.

Regarding mixed marriages, the statement declared that a Lutheran pastor "shall not participate in a wedding in which the parties must promise to rear children in the Roman faith."

However, it said that "there is no objection to attendance by Lutherans at baptisms, weddings, funerals, and dedications in churches of other denominations as long as such attendance does not involve a compromise of the Lutheran confessions."



Scripture Scholars

New Orleans—(RNS)—These two women Scripture experts were prominent at the 29th general meeting of the Catholic Biblical Association of America in New Orleans. They are Dr. Josephine Massingberd Ford, first lay woman to become a full-time member of the Notre Dame University faculty; and Mother Kathryn Sullivan, research professor of Sacred Scripture at Manhattanville College, Purchase, N.Y. Dr. Ford was the first lay woman to become an active member of the Biblical association, while Mother Kathryn was the association's first woman member.
