

Inhalation Therapy Unit, New Service in Hornell

The Inhalation Therapy Department, a new service for better patient care, has recently been instituted at the St. James Mercy Hospital, Hornell.

Michael Shannon, inhalation therapist, has been named supervisor of the new department, which is under the direct medical supervision of Dr. G. B. Ross, who this spring directed and set-up the Cardiac Arrest Cart has been instrumental in

establishing the new department.

Inhalation Therapy, a branch of the paramedical field, is the science and art of treating respiratory disorders both preventative and treatmentwise. It is accomplished through the use of various types of equipment, combination of gases and medications applied with various techniques.

All oxygen, aerosol and resuscitator equipment now comes under the supervision of the department. Mr. Shannon said, "Inhalation therapy is administered to pre-operative and post-operative patients and is most valuable in preventing respiratory complications." He further stated that the field of I.T. is a fairly new one, having been introduced only within the last decade.

Services in the department are available seven days a week and are provided between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. daily, while members of the inhalation therapy staff are on call at all times for emergency complications.

Members of the I.T. team include Mr. Shannon, Clarence Bradley and Joseph McCormick, assisted by the nurses of the school of nursing and in-service training sessions are being conducted.

Mr. Shannon came to St. James in July. He was formerly associated with Strong Memorial Hospital in Rochester. He attended Syracuse University and received his Inhalation Therapy training at the University of Rochester Medical Center.

He is a member of the national organization The American Association of Inhalation Therapists and is a member of the Western New York Chapter. He resides at the Big Elms Trailer Camp with his wife and two year old daughter.

At Notre Dame High School, Elmira

Convent, Chapel Blessed

"You cannot give what you haven't got," was the theme of the message given by Rev. Joseph F. Hogan at the dedication ceremonies of the new Notre Dame convent and chapel in Elmira last Saturday. Fourteen Elmira area priests and about fifty Sisters of Mercy, including Mother Mary Bride, Mother General of the congregation, attended.

Monsignor Leo G. Schwab, dean of the Elmira deanery of the Rochester diocese, celebrated Mass and officiated in the absence of Bishop Kearney, who was called to New York City because of his brother's illness.

Father Hogan, pastor of St. Vincent's parish in Corning, and first chaplain of Notre Dame from 1955 to 1961, urged the Sisters to retain the cordial spirit of friendliness which has always characterized their community. The "togetherness" which of necessity marked the old cramped convent quarters should now be even stronger, he said, though more

spacious surroundings could easily lead to isolation.

Encouraging the Sisters to enjoy each other in true family sociability, he remarked that such a spirit overflows into their relations with students and others with whom they deal every day.

Ending with a reminiscence of the opening of Notre Dame eleven years ago, Father Hogan recalled the fine record Notre Dame has made since then, athletically as well as scholastically, in the Elmira-area.

After the Mass in honor of the Feast of Our Lady of Mercy, patroness of the community, Monsignor Schwab read the prayers of blessing for the house and proceeded to bless each major room and area of the convent.

During the afternoon, open house was held for about 300 Sisters of Mercy from the Rochester diocese, who toured the convent and were served a buffet supper in the school cafeteria.
