Red Victim To Speak To Legion

A former prisoner of the Chinese Communists will be the principal speaker at the diocesan-wide Legion of Mary Congress to be held at Nazareth College Saturday, Oct. 15.

Father Aedan McGrath is credited with founding a thousand units of the Legion of Mary (an average of more than three each day) in the last year. China was a free nation, to preserve the Catholic faith when he foresaw priests would be banished and churches closed.

Arrested in 1951 he was in prison for two years and eight months and witnessed scores of Chinese Christians led off to martyrdom.

His talk to Legion members will include details of his prison experience and the heroism of martyrs he knew personally.

CFM Plans Consolidation

Caracas — (RNS) — Consolidation of Christian Family Movements in Europe and North and South America, with a combined membership of 100,000 couples, was reported here.

An agreement on confederation was reached at the Fourth Latin American Convention of the CFM movement. More than 1,000 Roman Catholic delegates from the Spanish-speaking world, including Spain, as well as observers from the United States, Canada and France attended. Among U.S. observers were Mr. and Mrs. Fred Stitt, an Episcopal couple from Chicago.

Mr. and Mrs. Jose Alvarez-Icaza of Mexico were named provisional co-presidents of the confederation until elections can be held. They currently head the Latin American federation.

Martyr's Life Now a Drama

Dublin — (RNS) — A Roman Catholic pastor in County Kildare is a successful novelist who has now written a play on the martyrdom, trial and execution of Blessed Oliver Plunket, 17th Century martyred Archbishop of Armagh.

Father Maurice Browne, who heads the parish in Ballymore Eustace and is a brother of Michael Cardinal Browne, a member of the Roman Curia, writes under the pen-name of Joseph Brady.

His novel, "The Big Sycamore" has gone into its seventh edition; another, "In Monavilla," has just been translated into German.

Emmett Hanna Funeral Held

Funeral Mass for Emmett J. Hanna, Sr. was offered by Father Frederick E. Eismann in SS. Peter and Paul's Church, Rochester, Sept. 21. Mr. Hanna, 71, of 585 Main St. West, an employe of the Rochester Gas and Electric Corp. for 40 years, died Sept. 18, 1966 after a long illness.

Mr. Hanna was the son of a local dentist, the late Dr. John Hanna. His mother died four weeks ago at the age of 94. He attended Immaculate Conception School and old Cathedral High School.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Lillian Hanna; one daughter, Mrs. Robert (Geraldine) Gobeil; one son, Emmett Jr., of Pasadena, Calif.; two sisters, Mrs. (Madeline) Scherer, Mrs. Geraldine Lyons; six grandchildren, his sister-in-law, Mrs. John R. (Betty) Hanna, several nieces, nephews.

Atheism Challenges Faith

Notre Dame — (RNS) — Contemporary atheism has "awakened the religious conscience from complacency to an ashamed awareness of its own shortcomings," a Jesuit priest told 135 philosophers and scholars at a symposium on "Philosophy in an Age of Christian Renewal" at the University of Notre Dame.

Father Robert O. Johanan of Fordham University spoke of atheism's challenge, although he observed that atheism destroys religious symbols in espousing the cause of human freedom and creativity.

Atheism, the New York priest

said, is today a kind of "living presupposition." It is no longer the conclusion of an argument but is "the implicit starting point of a concrete way of life." Atheism permeates the contemporary scene "like the air we breathe," he added.

Modern atheism, Father Johanan said, collides with this dilemma: "To absolutize the particular is superstition and idotry; to refuse to particularize the absolute is to deprive it of practical bearing. Religion (for the atheist) is therefore either dehumanizing or without significance."

The Jesuit took note of an

"unbelief of the believer" which he said is atheism in the midst of religious-minded people. By particularizing God and giving religion a special domain in life, he said, a specific pattern of behavior is established.

"Conformity to this pattern is required if one is to be on good terms with the Supreme Being.

"Since this is what counts, a person may go through the prescribed motions — and consider himself a believer — without even holding that God exists. He behaves 'religiously' just in case — as a kind of insurance policy."
