Legion of Mary Congress Next Week

25 Years Ago

Solemn Funeral Mass for Monsignor John P. Schellhorn, pastor emeritus of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church was offered by Bishop Kearney. Father Francis J. Hoefen, pastor preached the eulogy.

A citation for outstanding and distinguished services to the cause of Hibernianism was awarded to Joseph F. Redding, 84 Troup St., Rochester at the Ancient Order of Hibernians national convention.

Approved by Bishop Kearney, state chaplain, Father John V. Loughlin of St. Bernard's Seminary faculty was named chaplain of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus.

A congress for upstate members of the Legion of Mary will be held at Nazareth College Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 15 and 16.

Theme of the meeting for apostolic lay people is "The Apostolate of the Laity through Mary." Speakers are scheduled to link the Irish-originated organization with recent decisions of the Vatican Council.

Father Aedan McGrath, Irish Columban Father, more than two years a prisoner of the Chinese Communists, will be keynote speaker for the congress Saturday at 10 a.m. His topic will be "Mary and the Legion in our Ecumenical World."

Workshops on recruiting new members, catechetical work, ecumenical projects, alcoholism and "challenging works" will follow Father McGrath's talk.

Workshop speakers will include Monsignor Albert Schnacky, Father James Russell, Father Bartholomew O'Brien, Sister Marietta, Peter Kress and Alfred Corchia of New York City.

A panel discussion on junior members of the legion will be led by the speaker at the congress dinner Saturday evening at Vince's Fifty Acres.

Bishop Kearney will open the Sunday congress program with Mass at the chapel of the Motherhouse of the Sisters of St. Joseph. He will speak at

the breakfast to follow. Closing event will be a regular conium meeting of the Rochester Legion units and the

final talk by Father McGrath. Attendance at the congress events is not limited to Legion members.

Requiem for Felix Hart, Registrar of Aquinas

Bishop Kearney gave the Absolution at the Solemn Funeral Mass for Felix F. Hart, Registrar of Aquinas Institute for nearly 30 years, and brother of the late

Monsignor William M. Hart, former Vicar General of the Diocese of Rochester, offered in St. Augustine's Church, Tuesday, Oct. 3.

Mr. Hart of 229 Rugby Ave., known to thousands of Aquinas graduates, died Saturday, Oct. 1, 1966.

The Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Father Wil-

son for maintaining student records and sending transcripts to colleges throughout the country. He retired because of ill health in 1962 and at that time was feted at a faculty banquet for his years of service to the school.

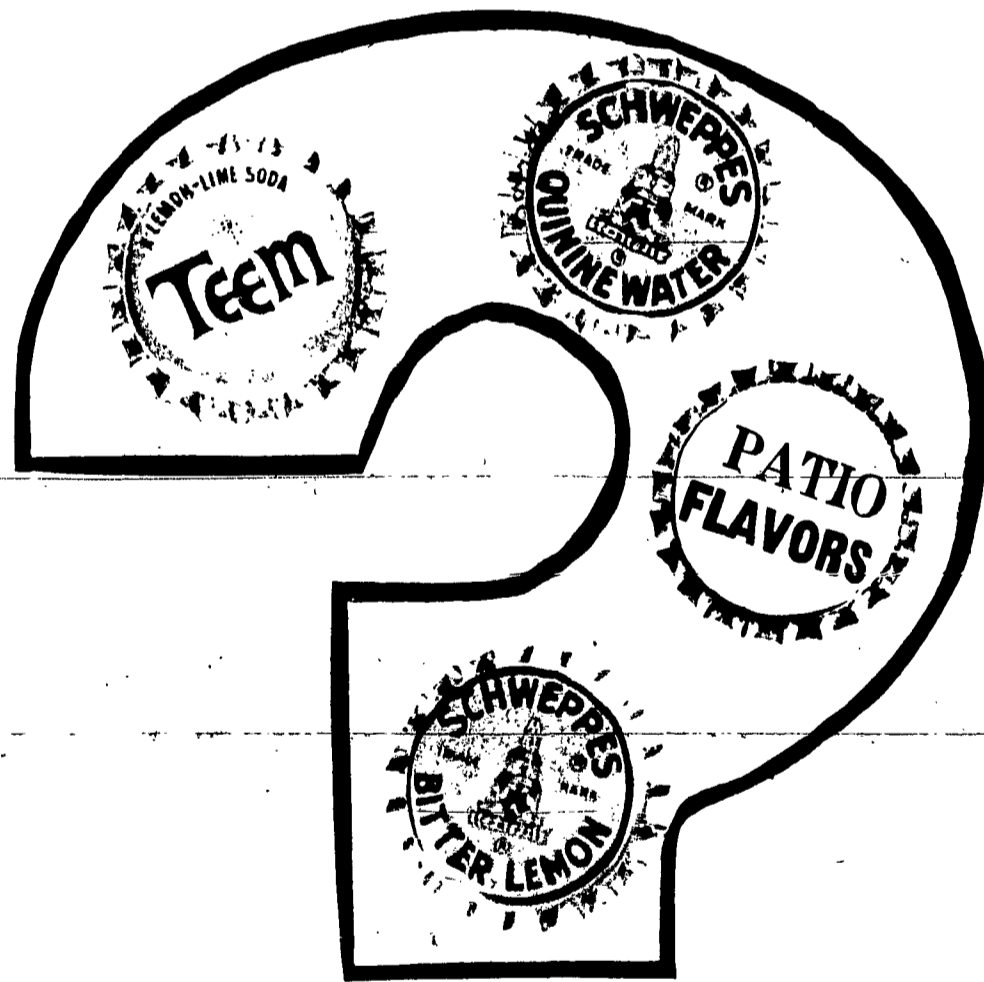
