

## 'Positive Image' Said Goal of Serrans

Atlantic City—(RNS)—Ways and means of projecting a "positive image" of the priesthood in the secular and Catholic press and of avoiding "distortions" and "misconceptions" came under study at a regional meeting of Serra International.

Sessions were attended by more than 200 members and chaplains of 34 branches of Serra, an organization of businessmen devoted to fostering vocations to the priesthood.

One speaker, Msgr. William N. Field, library director at Seton Hall University, challenged the Serrans to "oppose those concepts of the misfit priests played up by today's press."

He urged them to foster a "true picture of the priesthood" and to discern the "real priest" from the "distortion of the romanticist or the anti-cleric."

Bishop Michael W. Hyle of Wilmington stressed the humanity of priests who, despite failures, continue to sanctify mankind, developing in the hearts and minds of others a deep respect for Christ.

While "bad reports are disseminating in one way," he said, "they are a tribute to those who carry out their missions as priests; these reports emphasize the exceptional work of the majority."

Msgr. Salvatore J. Adamo, executive editor of the Catholic Star Herald of Camden, N.J., agreed that the positive side of the priesthood should be stressed whenever possible, but asserted that "we can't fabricate good stories. If we want to accept the positive, the positive must come first."

Vocations are too important to be glamorized, he observed. "We can't highlight the glories and sweep problems in the priesthood under the rug. We must meet them head on."
