Post-Mortem Praise

Notre Dame—(RNS)—Margaret Sanger, pioneer proponent of birth control who died earlier this year, was praised as a courageous "altruist" by the national Catholic weekly, Ave Maria, published here by the Holy Cross Fathers.

In an editorial tribute in its Sept. 24 issue, Ave Maria applauded Mrs. Sanger as "not only an altruist but a practicing altruist, and our respect is compelled by the courage of her convictions, her willingness to put herself on the firing line, her fidelity to her vision and to her cause."

"Her vision was of a world in which all children would have from birth the opportunity to be fed and cared for, to be educated, to be loved. Her cause was working to bring about that world by limiting the number of children to be born—especially to families of meager or reduced means. Few of us are so hard-hearted that we fail to share her vision, whatever our reservations about her cause and choice of means of birth-limitation."

The editorial noted that "unhappily, much of the most bitter and least charitable criticism of Mrs. Sanger came from Catholics."

But today, it continued, her concept of responsible parenthood "is an acceptable term in the Church, and no matter what the Pope decides on 'the birth control question,' it is clear that the automatic attitudes of another day—the attitudes that made Mrs. Sanger seem a bogymon to many of us—no longer serve."

Included in the Ave Maria tribute is a statement from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., praising the birth control pioneer for her "striking kinship between our movement and Margaret Sanger's early efforts." Dr. King, when he received the Margaret Sanger Award in Human Rights in 1965, praised her as a pioneer not only in the advocacy of birth control but in the use of non-violent direct action to correct the social evils she saw.

Ave Maria's editorial concluded: "To which we would add only: 'Eternal rest grant unto her...'"

Sex Education in Schools At Neanderthal Level

Atlantic City—(NC)—A Paulist priest charged here that educators and parents are failing children in instruction on sex and family life.

In schools, said Father George Hagmaler, C.S.P., sex education is in the "Neanderthal stage." Parents are mute, he told a session of the annual meeting of the American Association of School Administrators.

In contrast to this, he said, "the community at large bombards our young people with a barrage of learning, stimulating half-truths."

Father Hagmaler, professor of religious education at the Catholic University of America, lamented "the ominous vacuum in most public school curricula which fail to develop healthy sexual attitudes." The association whose meeting he addressed is composed of public school principals and superintendents.

He chided officials for their "cowardice or indifference in neglecting to prepare young Americans for the vocation of marriage to which most of them are certainly called."

"Other academic skills are continuously improved upon in the classroom, but the primary future responsibilities of home and family are often completely ignored by educators."

"Inadequate young people become inadequate parents and so basic shortcomings extend into future generations," he said.
