Auburn—More than 500 persons turned out to honor E. Alfred Rossi as he received the "Man of the Year" award from the Christopher Columbus Commemorative Committee at the fourth annual testimonial dinner-dance Oct. 12 at the Auburn Inn.

The presentation was made by Francis J. Mastropietro, president of the committee, who read the following inscription from the plaque presented: "To E. Alfred Rossi as a tribute for his outstanding industrial achievements." Rossi was also presented with an oil painting of himself. He is president of the Procino-Rossi Macaroni Products Company.

FATHER JOHN NACCA, pastor of St. Francis Church, was the principal speaker at the dinner. Father Nacca said, "Mr. Rossi is a man of many virtues and among these is his loyalty to his adoptive country, a country I am sure he is proud of."

Father Nacca also said, "Mr. Rossi has done his duty to promote his religion and ideals in this country."

The guest of honor was given a long standing ovation.

He inquired from the principal of the parish school, Sister Teresa Gerard, about someone who could come to talk to the St. Ann's people, and, as a result, invited Sister M. Florian, a member of the Diocesan Liturgical Committee and Director of Liturgy in her religious community, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester.
