Dialog on Mixed Marriage

Chicago — (RNS) — Presbyterian-Reformed and Roman Catholic representatives declared here at the close of a fourth theological conversation that they look forward "with ecumenical hope" to a future which will find both religious traditions experiencing new doctrinal development and understanding.

In addition to discussing current theological barriers — and scheduling for their next meeting, in April 1967, one of the thorniest of divisive subjects, mixed marriage — the spokesmen for the two groups met here in an atmosphere of common worship.

THE SESSIONS are being sponsored by the World Presbyterian Alliance's North American Area Council and the Commission for Ecumenical Affairs of the U.S. Catholic Hierarchy.

Presbyterian and Reformed groups taking part were the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A., the United Church of Christ, the Reformed Church in America, the Presbyterian Church in America and the C u m b e r l a n d Presbyterian Church.

In slating mixed marriage for the next session, on April 27-29 at St. John's University in Collegeville, Minn., the joint group agreed to consider problems involved in pre-nuptial promises, the celebration of marriage by clergy of both faiths, the education of children, birth control and common worship of the Christian family.
