"Caesar and Cleopatra" will be presented at Notre Dame High School, Elmira, Dec. 2 and 3, directed by Robert J. Lynough, Notre Dame drama coach.

The play, written by George Bernard Shaw, presents a very shrewd and unromantic Caesar and a very young, kittenish Cleopatra. Caesar reinstalls her on her throne, but the Queen is far from imperial and has a childish longing for power and revenge. He tries in vain to hasten her maturity, and at the end almost forgets to say goodbye to her. She is sad, but consoled by Caesar's promise to send her a younger man — Antony.

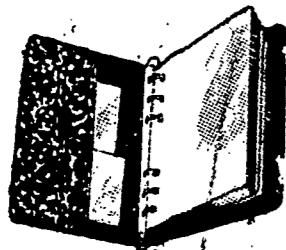
Charity Ladies Slate Mass For Deceased

'Al Sigi Center' Named to Honor Veteran Broadcaster, Humanitarian

The "Al Sigi Center," a \$3.8 million Monroe County Center for Rehabilitation Agencies is rising at Elmwood and South Avenues. The new structure was named for "a man who devoted

his entire life to the underprivileged and the handicapped."

Justin Vigdor, president of the organization's board of trustees who made the announcement of the name of the building will be completed by November, 1967.

Sigi, known wide for his radio broadcasts and humanitarian programs began his career as a 23-year-old reporter on the Union and Advertiser, predecessor of the Times-Union.

In his early days, he also served as a member of the faculties of Cathedral High School and later Nazareth College.

He established the Blood Bank which became nationally known and put into operation.

From 1928 when he was heard over WHAM and later on WHEC in newscasts, he broadcast until the summer of 1958 when illness forced his retirement.

The Al Sigi Center, a multi-level complex, will house several agencies supported by the Community Chest: the Day Care Center for Handicapped Children, Association for Retarded Children, Cerebral Palsy Association, Rochester Rehabilitation Center, Hearing and Speech Center, Medical Motor Center and Rochester Association for Multiple Sclerosis.

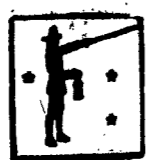

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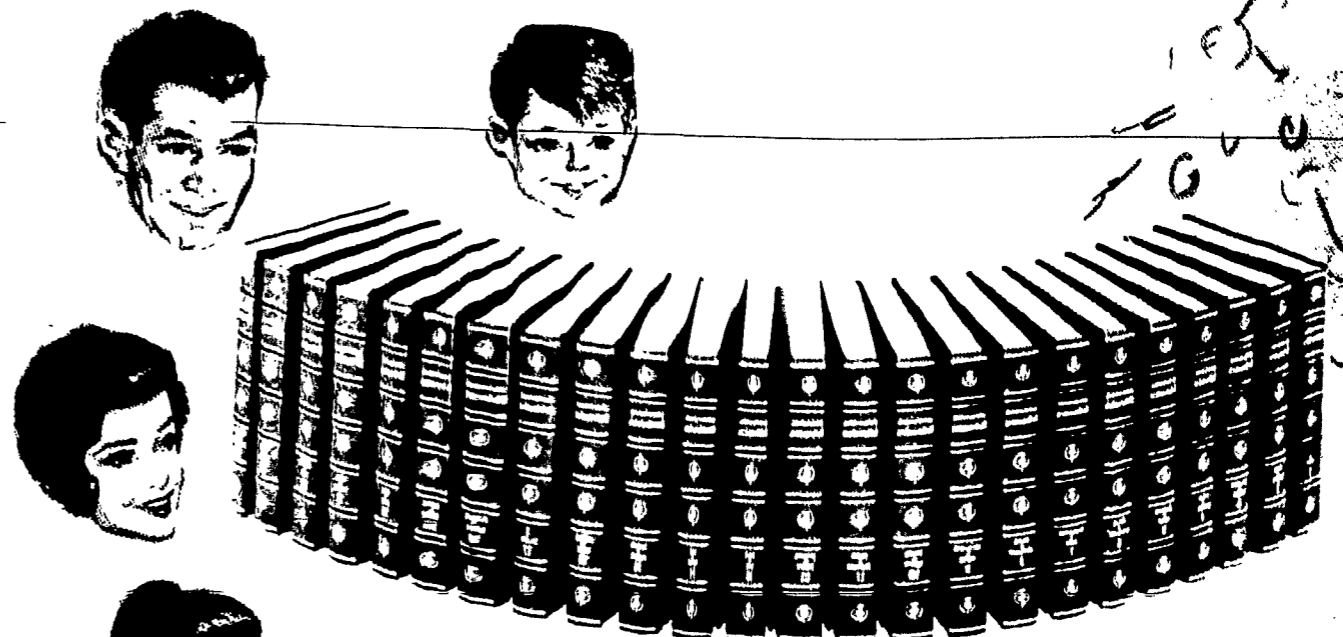
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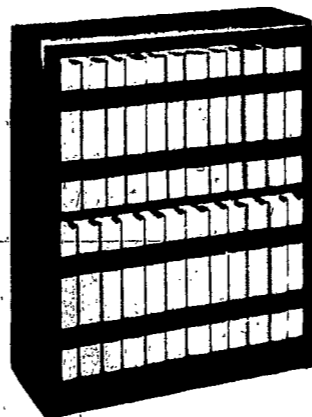
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
