She Rocks and Rolls Up A Hit for U.S. Overseas

Dubuque—To promote international understanding, a pretty, freckle-faced teenager decided not long ago to use an international language—rock 'n' roll.

Not this nation's, mind you, but Thailand's.

Miss Kennedy's "home" is Bangkok, the country's capital, where her father is a United Nations economic adviser.

When she went home for a visit last Christmas, she was met at the Bangkok airport by reporters and photographers.

not be there long, he immediately made room for her that week, even though it meant pushing another "big name" act back another week.

Although such fame is fleeting, Miss Kennedy has another record climbing the Thailand charts—her version of Gary Lewis' "Everybody Loves a Clown."

The reason Louise Kennedy is so popular in Thailand and why "Louise Kennedy Sings Puyai Lee" sold over 2,000 copies (like selling a million in the U.S.) is that she not only dared to put the folk-song words to a new rock rhythm, but took care to preserve the

Thai words. She has even translated "Everybody Loves a Clown" into Thai.

"I think they really appreciate an American trying to use their language," Miss Kennedy said. "I know of Americans who have lived in Bangkok for years and haven't bothered to learn one word of Thai. You can't blame the Thais for caring so little about us."

Now 19, Louise lived in and around New York City until she was 14, when her father (no relation to President Kennedy) was assigned to Bangkok in 1961.

"The school was all too much like home," said Louise, who was expecting to learn a lot about Oriental culture, "but I couldn't go to the Thai school

because I couldn't read and write the language. But I became friendly with the Thai secretary at the school and I began teaching English to some of her friends. In return, they taught me Thai."

Before long, she was teaching English on a Bangkok radio station, and by her senior year had her own Sunday-afternoon disk-jockey show. "The Thais like American music, but the only thing they were getting up until then was ancient Elvis Presley," she remembers.

"At the beginning it sounded to me like pots and pans being banged together," Louise said. "Actually, I couldn't begin to appreciate it until after I started learning the language, because in Thai, different words have different tones and the music is built around the sound of the words. And it took time to become accustomed to the unfamiliar singsong beat of Thai music."

One day her station manager heard her singing Thai to herself in the control room, invited her to participate in a jazz festival he was planning and Louise took him up on it.

"I recruited a combo from among my friends and decided to have a try at 'Puyai Lee,' which is a sort of protest song, really. My Thai must have been terrible, but the audience applauded until I sang the song through twice."

American audiences will be able to see and hear the five-foot-three Miss Kennedy sing "Puyai Lee" during the "To Tell the Truth" telecast (right after three of the four panelists—Orson, Bear, Kitty Carlisle, Peggy Cass and Tom Poston—fall to single her out, giving their votes to two "impostors").

Her ambition is to continue the work she has done to date in foreign relations—but by teaching overseas or by working with a government agency

rather than by singing. And, if she has her way, in Thailand.

"I think of Bangkok as my home town," she said. "There's so much about it I miss, especially the gaiety and politeness of the people, their way of bowing to say hello and thank you."

But should she want to go on an overseas entertainment mission, she'll find that Clarke College can give her more than the history major she's seeking there.
