
WHO HAS A QUESTION? Question: Must I return the registration card in order to p.m. in parish center, Bay St. participate in the "POP" Game?

Set a specific goal for your FUNd-Raising (books, addition to school building, etc.), and frequently mention this goal to maintain interest and incentive. Distribute the "POP" Shopping List (which includes all of the products and services in the "POP" program); provide a convenient place to turn in label accumulation; continually inform the members about progress, new products and services. 1 stick (1/3-cup) BLUE BONNET WHIPPED MARGARINE


½ tsp. salt Peper (to taste)

Father Charles Borgognoni, widely known priest in the Syracuse area, will speak at the Nov. 29, at 8:30 p.m.


Father Borgognoni, Newman chaplain at Syracuse University, will speak on "The Church on the Secular Campus."
