

Author-Nun to Speak Here

Motion pictures, philosophy, Jewish-Christian dialogue, theology, and cerebral palsy are some of the interests of a lively lecturer who will give three talks in Rochester on the first weekend in December.

Author-poet-teacher and Sacred Heart nun, Mother Katherine Hargrove, will first address the annual Communion Breakfast of the Catholic Women's Club at the Midtown Plaza Tower on Sunday, Dec. 4 at 11 a.m.

HER TOPIC will be "Woman's Vocation in Contemporary Society." Club president, Mrs. Michael Culhane, has appointed Mrs. Thomas Craig and Mrs. William R. Noonan Jr., as co-chairman of the event.

The Dept. of Theology at St. John Fisher College will sponsor Mother Hargrove's second appearance on Sunday, Dec. 4, at 7:15 p.m. Her talk on "The Theology of Federico Fellini" will be given in the theater of St. Basil Hall on the East Avenue campus. It will be followed by a discussion and a showing of the Italian director's movie "La Strada."

Mother Hargrove will be the guest speaker at a dinner sponsored by the

sored by the Rosary Society of Our Lady of Lourdes Church on Monday, Dec. 5, at 6:30 p.m. in the parish hall. Mrs. Joseph R. Vasile, president, has invited each member of the Society to bring a Jewish neighbor to the dinner as a guest. In keeping with the special ecumenical aspect of the evening, Mother Hargrove will review "The Star and the Cross," a book of essays concerned with Jewish-Christian relations which she edited and for which she was recently named the recipient of the Edith Stein Award by the editors of "Catholic World." Mrs. Benedict Messner is program director and Mrs. Thomas DeStefani is chairman of this event.

Mother Hargrove earned one master's degree in philosophy at The Catholic University of America and another in religious education from Providence College. From 1946 until 1949 she was mistress general and mistress of studies at the Academy of the Sacred Heart on Prince Street, Rochester. Since 1951 she has been associate professor of Religion at Manhattanville College of the Sacred Heart in Purchase, N.Y.

Currently Mother Hargrove is working on a book for the United Cerebral Palsy Foundation which is aimed at kindling new hope in the parents of children with cerebral palsy. She first became involved in working with handicapped children through work at St. Agnes Hospital in Westchester County near the Manhattanville campus. She has since then written articles on this topic for "America" and "Religious Education," as well as worked on the production of a short movie on the subject.

During the present academic year Mother Hargrove is on a special teaching assignment at Maryville College of the Sacred Heart in St. Louis, Missouri, where she is engaged in structuring a college course in religion around the use of movies. This experimental project is called "God and the Film."

Mother Hargrove is the author of numerous articles and poems which have appeared in periodicals such as Worship, The Sign, The Catholic Mind, Bible Today, Cross and Crown, Inter-racial Review. She is also a contributor of several articles to the New Catholic Encyclopedia.

Mass Offered For Sr. Gerard Majella

Sister Gerard Majella Sheehan, a member of the Sisters of St. Joseph for more than sixty years, died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, Sunday morning, Nov. 13, 1966.

Requiem Mass was celebrated by Father Thomas Sheehan, a nephew, assisted by Monsignor Albert H. Schnacky. Also attending were Monsignor William M. Roche, and Reverend Fathers George M. Kalb, J. Norman Margrett and Donald J. Murphy.

The blessing in the Sister's Plot, Holy Sepulchre Cemetery was given by Father Sheehan assisted by Father Kalb.

Sister Gerard Majella was born in Ireland and entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1906.

Surviving are a sister, Mrs. Daniel O'Sullivan, and four brothers, Father Jerome Sheehan, also Michael, Thomas and Patrick. Sheehan all of Ireland, several Rochester convents for shorter periods, including Holy Rosary, Corpus Christi, Holy Apostles, St. Ambrose and St. Bridget's. She retired from active duty in 1961.

Papal Crucifix For Protestants

Chester, England — (RNS) — A silver-plated crucifix sent as a personal gift by Pope Paul VI hung from a pillar of a new church when it was dedicated for the joint use of Anglicans and Methodists.

St. Barnabas church, built in the new town of Hatterley at a cost of \$61,000, was dedicated by the Anglican Bishop of Chester, Dr. Gerald Ellison, in the presence of Princess Margaret.

The Pope sent the crucifix, which bears the papal coat of arms in recognition of what is described as the first British venture of its kind towards Christian unity. The new church will cater for mixed congregations of Anglicans and Methodists, whose ministers will conduct all services jointly. The congregations will be segregated only for communion, which will be taken on either side of an altar rail separated by a prie-dieu as a symbol of the real division that still exists in the church.

In dedicating the church Bishop Ellison recalled that its two ministers — the Rev. Noel Pyatt, Anglican, and the Rev. Derek Bedford, Methodist — had surveyed the basic tasks facing them in the new community and had decided it would be a shameful scandal if they presented a divided witness to the Christian faith. So they had sought and gained permission to share their ministry in every respect which could properly be shared.

The experiment in which they will take part is not a pretence, the bishop said. It does not "shut its eyes" to the differences which still exist between Anglicans and Methodists (whose leaders are currently negotiating on possible union of the two Churches).

"Indeed," added Bishop Ellison, "at the Holy Communion, at that moment when unity should be shown between Christians and cannot yet be shown, the scandal of division will be present as each body partakes separately. But here will be a shared ministry as priest and minister, with their people."

A testimonial dinner honoring Raymond L. Nary, retiring Master of the Fifth District, Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus will be held Saturday, Nov. 19 at Oak Hill Country Club.

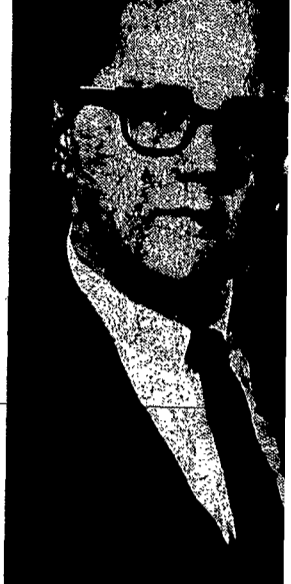
