**East Rochester Tonight Aquinas Cagers Meet**

The Aquinas basketball team will make its 1966 debut Friday evening at the Community War Memorial when it meets East Rochester in the first game of a doubleheader. In the second game McQuaid will play Irondequoit.

A 14-week basketball schedule for varsity and junior varsity Aquinas Institute basketball teams was released today by Rev. Cyril F. Carter, C.S.B., athletic director.

This season's schedule features 18 games including two contests in the Aquinas Invitational Tournament on Dec. 27 and 30 at R.I.T.

Aquinas will also compete in the annual Catholic Diocesan Basketball Tournament set for

mid-March. The Irish, defending champs, will be looking for their fifth trophy in the eight-year history of the tourney.

Regular season play will find the Irish at home for only 3 games with five appearances at the War Memorial.

No new teams are scheduled for Aquinas this season.

Jack Kelly will be starting his fourth season as Aquinas' coach when the Irish open against East Rochester. Last year Aquinas split with the John Baynes-coached Bombers. The Aquinas junior varsity dropped two close games that season to ER.

Kelly has only four letter men returning. Possible starters include 6'2" Dick Barron at center, Jim Murawski (6'1") and Jim Brady (6'2") at forward and a combination of Paul Fiore (5'8"), Richie Greenwood (6'1") and Dan Hogan (5'10") in the back court.

Although lacking in size, Kelly appears to have good balance and better than average shooters. Game time is set for 7 p.m.

**8-0 Football Record**

**Perfect Season For Mt. Carmel**

The first undefeated football team in the nine year history of the varsity sport at Mount Carmel High School was honored Tuesday, Nov. 15 by being awarded the championship trophy by the Wayne-Finger Lakes Football Conference.

The presentation was made by Larry Russell, coach at Waterloo, to coach Ron Carnicella at the annual Finger Lakes Football Officials dinner at the Seneca Lakes Country Club in Geneva.

Mt. Carmel finished the W.F.L. League with a 7-0 record to win its first crown. The Crusaders

had an overall season record of 8-0.

Sparkling the well-balanced Carmel eleven this past grid season was halfback Dick Rusinko. The blonde bomber carried 134 times and had an average of 8.7 yards per carry. He rushed for 1,195 yards, caught six passes for 85 yards for a grand total of 1,280 yards. The senior halfback scored 16 touchdowns.

His scoring mate at the fullback post was Ron Cook, an elusive speedster who tallied 14 touchdowns. Cook rushed for 360 yards and had 23 pass receptions which covered 436 yards.

Quarterback Bill Foster was also outstanding as a passer and as a field general. He completed 37 out of 81 aerials for 771 yards and nine touchdowns. Bill also has another year at Carmel.

George Bodine, who played both ways on the line, kicked 10 extra points and also added a field goal.

Tim Bergan, who was the team quarterback but gave way to Foster when he fractured a collar bone early in the season, turned out to be a fine end after rejoining the club. End John Marcon was a deft pass receiver and a tough defensive end.

Sophomore linebacker John Hogan, Jerry Oliver and Tommy Prystal along with giant tackle Ted Freeman, Bodine and Phil Marcon paced the defense. Captain Carbonaro and center Tony Piccolo made up the rest of the regulars on the line who were standouts all season.

Carmel opened its season by edging a strong St. Mary's of Cortland team 25-20 in a non-league game. Coach Carnicella's Crusaders then rolled over Lyons, 24-6; Penn Yan, 35-7; Mynese Academy of Seneca Falls, 19-0; Clyde, 47-6; Geneva, 33-14; Waterloo, 15-7 and DeSales of Geneva, 59-27.

**Kings Lose**

Bishop Kearney ended the 1966 football season with a 3-4 record as they lost to Cardinal Farley Military Academy last Sunday at Aquinas Stadium.

The Cadets from Rhine-cliff, New York, presented a strong defense which all but stopped the Bishop Kearney offensive unit.

**Mooney Cagers Open Season Saturday Night**

Cardinal Mooney High School basketball team opens its season at home this Saturday, November 26, 1966 when it tangles with Fairport Central of the

County League. The Raiders, coached by genial Wes Paddock, boast a solid veteran club and will be fighting for top honors in the county league this year.

Mooney, after a 17 win and 4 loss record last year, faces a rebuilding job this season as the Cardinals lost eight lettermen to graduation. Also lost for most of the season are two boys that were heavily counted on. Forward Dick Muscolov is out with a knee injury received during the last football game against Jamestown and Tom Bringley who suffered a shoulder dislocation in an early season workout.

Back for the Cardinals are two starters. All-Catholic Senior Forward Jim Harrington at 6'1" and Senior Forward Otis David at 6'10". Handling the backcourt for Mooney will probably be Senior Guard Dan Shonker at 5'7" and Sophomore Guard Doug Farrell at 5'8". 6'1" Sophomore Dick Felber will take over the pivot duties for the Greece Catholic School. Boys who have also been hustling for a starting position are Juniors Ray Redding 6'2" center, Bary Braun 5'11" forward and Sophomore Guard Terry Meagher at 6'10". Senior Dick Palumbo and Juniors Bob Makowski, Bob Glass and Tim Farrell round out the team.
