McQuaid Jesuit High opened its basketball season by defeating Mt. Carmel, 54-49, Sunday afternoon at Auburn.

This Friday night, the Knights face Irondequoit at the War Memorial in the second half of a high school doubleheader: Aquinas and East Rochester tangle in the opener.

High scorer for McQuaid at Auburn was senior John Kotler with 21 points while Bob Eedecker of the losers hit for 22.

Down, 12-11, at the end of the first quarter, McQuaid rallied for 9 straight points, 6 by Bob Weingartner, to grab a 20-12 lead which they never lost. The Knights led, 35-23, at the half.

Kotler gave the Knights their biggest lead, 48-32, with a foul shot to start the last quarter, but Mt. Carmel rallied with 17 points in the closing minutes to tighten the final score. Nine of the points came on foul shots against the pressing McQuaid defense. However the Knights made enough key baskets to keep the home team from closing in.
