### Rochester Musicians At Missouri Meeting

"Harmony and Discord: An Open Forum on Church Music" was the title of a three-day conference sponsored jointly by the Church Music Association of America and the Liturgical Conference in Kansas City, Missouri, from Nov. 29 to Dec. 1. The Diocese of Rochester was represented at the conference by Father Benedict A. Ehmann of St. Michael's Church, Rochester; Basilian Father Peter E. Sheehan of St. John Fisher College, both members of the diocesan Liturgical Commission and Music Commission, and Sister M. Florian, S.S.J., of Nazareth Motherhouse, a member of the Music Commission.

Participants were invited to the conference from diocesan commissions throughout the country in order to resolve the differences which have arisen between musicians and liturgists over the implementation of the Vatican Council's liturgical reforms.

A two-fold problem was presented by various speakers for discussion: "one the need for song and the place of song have

been established, the next question comes to mind: what type of music lends itself to a genuine experience of faith?" During the series of talks, discussions and demonstrations, the liturgists and musicians attempted to resolve the differences of opinion and approaches among themselves which might be halting progress.
