**Three Virtues For Businessmen**  
Vatican City—(RNS)—Pope Paul VI listed honesty, competence and social sense as the three virtues men of business and industry should cultivate.

The occasion was an audience to members of the Catholic Union of Portuguese Industrialists and Directors. The Pope delivered a talk in French later broadcast by Vatican Radio with the comment it was "applicable to industrialists the world over."  
"Honesty," the Pope said, "means a very sure moral sense, a susceptibility keenly aware of what is just and unjust and manifested, for example, in a procedure on about the remuneration due to the worker which should enable the latter to bring up his family in a worthy manner."

After stressing that the economical and organizational aspects of a Christian enterprise are not everything and that the head of such an enterprise cannot look for success at the price of a compromise with his conscience, the Pope went on to discuss the importance of competence on the part of the employer.  
"Modern society," he said, "is characterized by an inevitable evolution which the Christian employer cannot overlook. He is witnessing on the one hand the passing from the empirical phase to the scientific, cultural phase in the development of his country. On the other hand, ownership of an enterprise which at one time did not involve directing it now nearly always implies direct management."

Speaking of the social sense, Pope Paul said "an enterprise is a work directed by men, worked by men and at the service of men, and therefore it demands of the director a constant attention to the Christian character of his task."  
"This task is concerned with men and takes the form of the free manifestation of the talents of each one in seeking sincere collaboration with the enterprise, in sensitivity, beyond the limits of one's own interests, to the common good of the region, the nation and the continent to which he belongs."

**Still Meatless**  
Warsaw — (RNS)—Meatless Fridays will continue to be the rule for Roman Catholics in Poland.  
At a time when the traditional abstinence law was being lifted for Catholics in the United States, France, and elsewhere, Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski, Primate of Poland, issued a pastoral letter instructing Catholics to continue the practice. He acted for all of the nation's Bishops.  
The cardinal's pastoral was dated Oct. 17, but not read in churches which was "a very important standpoint of the Church about penitence."
