### Pope Names Fr. M. LeFrois

Very Rev. Marvin J. LeFrois, a native of Rochester, was elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor by Pope Paul VI, according to Bishop Thomas J. McDonough of Savannah, Georgia diocese.

Monsignor LeFrois was named pastor of St. Anne's Church in Columbus, Ga. and Vicar Forane of the Columbus Deanery, in September, this year. He was appointed to the newly created post of Episcopal Vicar in the Diocese of Savannah in October.

Father LeFrois was born in Rochester, the son of Mr. and Mrs. George LeFrois of Stone Road. He attended St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries and was ordained in Sacred Heart Cathedral, June 11, 1949.

Father LeFrois is a brother of Father Vincent E. LeFrois, pastor of Holy Angels parish, Nunda, and Holy Name, Groveland; Father Christian Glenn LeFrois, O.S.B., a veteran United States Air Force chaplain, and Father Joseph LeFrois, S.S.J., Norfolk, Va.

## 180 Youngsters Play In Instrumental Concert

Nazareth Academy Auditorium was the scene of an Instrumental Music Festival Saturday, Dec. 10, performed by one-hundred and eighty children from eighteen schools in the Rochester diocese.

An enthusiastic audience heard the Festival Band, under the direction of Louis Ugino, perform the "French Suite" by Lully as well as the "Highlights from Westside Story" by Bernstein. The Festival Orchestra presented a similarly varied program including the "Hymn of Freedom" from Brahms's C. Minor Symphony, and a "Tune and Workout for Youthful Orchestra" by Klesinger.

The String Orchestra played two "Hungarian Folk Tunes," and "Theme and Variations" by Papini-Appelbaum. A String Octet gave the audience a performance from the "Water Music" of Handel.

The children who participated in the concert were from schools staffed by the Sisters of St. Joseph.
