Theatre East's Thanksgiving "College Night" was so successful, with about 350 students from area campuses and at home on vacation, that Executive Director Lee Kheel stated a regular college night will be designated.

"We want to give students every possible price break, to give them opportunity to see plays recognized as good theater, professionally produced and performed in our lovely theater."

Theatre East has matinees on Thursdays, with \$1.50 ticket prices for students, and a number of high schools are participating in this drama education program. On Sunday nights, students receive a 50 cent discount on any priced ticket.

Reservations are held, at the theater box office, until one-half hour before show-time. Theatre East, located on the Monroe County Fairgrounds, E.
